OLDEST U. S. OCEAN FLEET TAKEN OVER

The oldest maritime fleet flying the American flag was on its way out of existence Wednesday following its requisition by the U. S. Maritime commission for defense purposes.

According to a Tuesday announcement by A. D. McDonald, president of the Southern Pacific railroad, the commission has ordered the firm to deliver its entire fleet, known as the Morgan line, to the government. Transfer of the ten ships is expected to be completed by late July.

The Morgan line was founded in 1835 and, except for a brief period during the Civil war, has continued uninterrupted operations for 106 years. Acquired by the S. P. in 1885, the steamship company afforded both freight and passenger service between north Atlantic and gulf ports.

Earlier this year, the S. S. Dixie, flagship of the line, was sold to the United States navy and the company was obliged to discontinue its service between New York and New Orleans.

An S. P. announcement said "The officers of the company greatly regret the circumstances which require the taking over of these ships by the government and the consequent discontinuance of the services of this line. They desire also to express their thanks to the many patrons who have utilized the services of the Morgan line for so many years."

The ten ships remaining of the Morgan operation, all of which have been taken for defense use, total 65,069 dead-weight tons.

State Highway Traffic Up Six Per Cent in 1940

SALEM, June 12 (AP)—Traffic over state highways during 1940 was six per cent greater

than in 1939, and 16 per cent more than in 1938, a state highway commission survey said today.

Traffic on the Pacific highway between the Interstate bridge and Portland increased 14 per cent. Counts made on

the highway at Gervais, north of Eugene, and south of Goshen showed increases of 9, 26 and 15 per cent, while there were no appreciable changes in southern Oregon.

Coast highway travel was up 5 per cent. Volume on the Columbia River highway between

Portland and Astoria dropped slightly, while there was no change on other sections of the Columbia River—Old Oregon Trail highway.
