RIISING TREND CROPS UP IN STOCK TRADE

NEW YORK, July 1 (AP)—Rising tendencies cropped up here and there in today's stock market but leaders generally exhibited a flabby appearance. Transfers were around 350,000 shares.

While business prospects brought in timid bidding for favorites, brokers said, many of those who might have joined the buying ranks again held aloof because of conflicting nationalized war claims—the Russians admitted German advances but insisted these were being stemmed—worries over the tax outlook and fears of industrial repercussions due to spreading governmental restrictions.

Another relapse in commodities, after a forenoon recovery attempt, was seen as a depressant for securities. Bonds were mixed.

Among stocks contesting downward currents were Standard Oil (NJ), which posted another new low for the year; American Can, Westinghouse, J. Case, International, Kennecott and United Aircraft.

In the backward division during the greater part of the proceedings were General Motors, American Telephone, American Smelting, U. S. Rubber, Montgomery Ward, Consolidated Edison, General Electric, Du Pont, Eastman Kodak, Allied Chemical, U. S. Gypsum and Boeing. Pepsi-Cola, the new listing for left resulting from the recent merger, was under water most of the time.

WHEAT PRICE CUT AS BUYERS LACKING

CHICAGO, July 1 (AP)—All grain futures prices broke sharply toward the end of the session today. The reaction was attributed to lack of buying interest and to hedging pressure. Reports of purchases of flour by eastern millers yesterday at times bolstered prices but heavy receipts in all markets and uncertainties over the controversy in Washington regarding price fixing proposals forced prices lower.

Final prices were slightly above the day's lowest. Wheat closed 1-1 cent lower than Monday's final quotations, July \$1.03 1/2, Sept. \$1.04 1/2; corn was 1/2 cent higher to 1 cent lower, July 73 1/2c, Sept. 75c; and oats were 1/2 to 1 cent off.
