

### RAILROADS FEEL LABOR SHORTAGE

A manpower shortage which may become acute was felt this week by the Great Northern railroad. The Southern Pacific also reported the supply of qualified trainmen was becoming scarce.

Increased business, both of defense nature and in stepped-up routine trade, has opened new vacancies, officials of both roads stated. The situation is complicated by the draft taking young men and defense industry jobs taking skilled employees at better pay.

Both the SP and GN reported a shortage in track men and trainyard service employees. The Great Northern also noted a lack of available experienced clerical help.

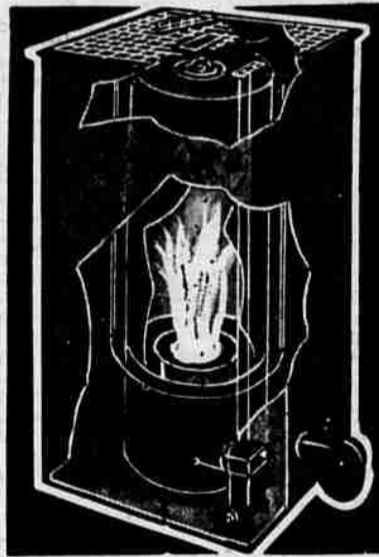

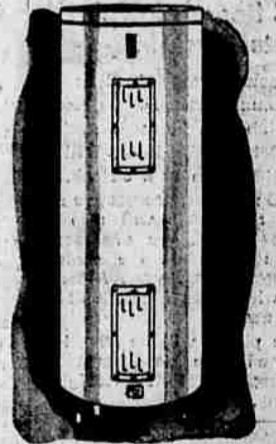
