



Oregon Gets \$56,415 for Wild Life

State Board Sets China Pheasant Feed; Doe Tags Exhausted for '41 Season

WASHINGTON, Aug. 13 (AP)—The fish and wild life service today apportioned \$2,530,000 among the 48 states Tuesday for restoration of wild life under the Pittman-Robertson act.

The funds will finance projects set up and directed by the states. The federal government pays 75 per cent of the cost of projects and the states contribute 25 per cent.

With the state contributions, the federal aid wild life work will total \$3,373,333.

Among apportionments to other states were:

Idaho, \$52,386; Montana, \$77,247; Oregon, \$56,415; Washington, \$63,896.

The fish and wild life service said that all but two states—Georgia and Nevada—had enacted legislation permitting the states to participate in the program.

SALEM, Aug. 13 (AP)—The state board of control decided Tuesday that China pheasant feed required by the game commission probably will be purchased on the basis both of substance and chemical analysis and will be manufactured under the supervision of the game commission.

E. E. Wilson, member of the game commission, told the board that some feed has been of low grade, and that inferior feed killed 1,500 pheasants at the Pendleton farm last year.

The board decided that the game commission should purchase its feed under contract, with bidders being required to meet rigid specifications drafted by the commission.

Wilson said the commission would raise 3,000 pheasants at the state prison farms next year.

PORTLAND, Aug. 21 (AP)—The state game commission reported today that the entire supply of doe deer tags for the hunting season this fall had been exhausted.

Three thousand were issued in the Grant, Wheeler and Crook counties area and 800 in the Lake-Klamath area.

The commission reported that antelope tags were still available.

New York Giants, whose 1941 exploits have been chiefly confined to setting losing streaks of various lengths, came to life Tuesday and dealt the pennant hopes of the Brooklyn Dodgers a double blow.

A couple of veterans—Mel Ott

and Cliff Melton—combined to lead the Giants to twin victories, 8-5 and 2-0, over the hapless Dodgers, who automatically dropped out of the National league lead.

Come From Behind

The St. Louis Cardinals bounced into first place, 1 1/2 games ahead of the Dodgers, by coming from behind to defeat the Chicago Cubs, 8-7. Creepy Crespi with three singles and a double was the Cardinal hero. His single in the eighth driving across the tying and winning runs.

A double by Mickey Livingston in the 13th inning gave the Philadelphia Phillies a 2-1 triumph over the Boston Braves. Jim Tobin, although found for 13 hits, checked the Phils until the 13th when Merrill May's single, a sacrifice and Livingston's wallop ended the battle.

Spud Chandler blanked the Boston Red Sox with six hits as the New York Yankees, after going scoreless for 37 straight innings in the stadium, scored a 4-0 triumph to move 14 games ahead of the Cleveland Indians who split with the Detroit Tigers.

Feller Defeated

Al Benton, recently converted from bullpen duty to starting chores, held the Indians to four hits for a 2-0 Detroit victory in the first game. Bobby Feller made his third appearance and suffered his third defeat in five days. He fanned seven to bring his season total to 205, making it the fourth consecutive season he has struck out 200 or more.

Cleveland snapped a six game losing streak with a 4-1 decision in the night cap as Al Milnar allowed five hits. It was his ninth win.

Dutch Leonard won his seventh straight and 13th of the year as Washington clipped Philadelphia 9-3. He allowed six hits.
