

# LOG HAULERS WARNED NOT TO OVERLOAD

PORTLAND, Aug. 15 (AP)—The state highway commission Thursday warned that log haulers who overloaded their trucks would be prosecuted.

"Weighmasters" have been appointed in various sections and all haulers must weigh their loads in transit. The law limits vehicles to 54,000 pounds for a single-axle truck-tractor and tandem-axle trailer. The law also grants a "tolerance" of 10 per cent on the total load and 1000 pounds on the axle.

The commission decided that where a weighmaster finds a truck overloaded, he is to give the violator an opportunity to surrender his P. U. C. license plates for five calendar days for the first offense, 10 for the second and 15 for the third in any 12-month period. Should the hauler refuse to surrender plates, the public utilities commission will be asked to cancel his permit.

Should the permit cover more than one truck the cancellation will put all the trucks out of service.

Alderman, Eugene, \$2288.50.

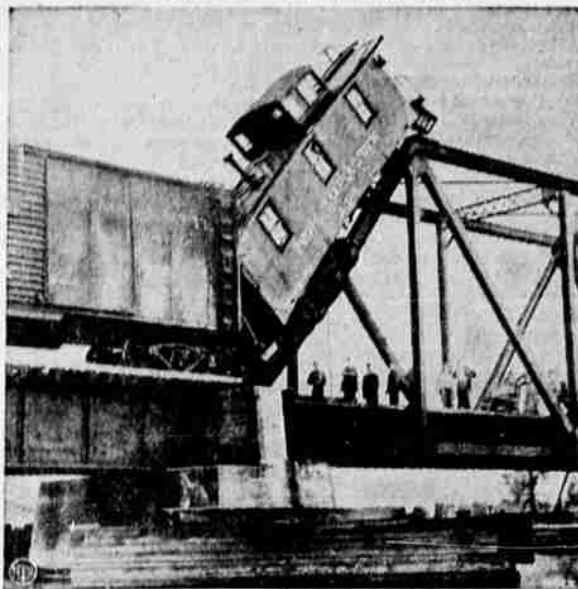

## Quick Frozen Meats Simple To Cook for Sunday Dinner

Sunday dinner during summer can be simplified with the help of modern science. Quick frozen meats and fowl, ready to cook without any preliminary work, cut down kitchen time. If these special foods fit comfortably in to the family budget, they can be used on Sunday to give the housewife more time outdoors with the other members of the family.

### SPANISH FRICASSEE OF CHICKEN (Serves 4 to 6)

One quick frozen fowl for fricassee, partially thawed, 1/2 cup butter or other fat, salt and pepper, 1 cup sliced onions, 1 cup diced celery, 1 cup sliced mushrooms, 4 cups canned or fresh stewed tomatoes, 2 tablespoons chopped parsley, 1/2 teaspoon sugar.

Separate fowl into pieces for serving. Sauté in butter, season with salt and pepper, and place in large kettle. Sauté onions, celery and mushrooms in drippings in pan. Add tomatoes and bring to a boil, stirring constantly. Add parsley and sugar and pour over chicken. Cook slowly, partially covered, 2 1/2 hours, stirring occasionally.

### MIXED GRILL (Serves 4)

Cups from 4-pound mushrooms or small rounds of eggplant, 4 quick frozen lamb chops, 1 box (8 ounces) quick frozen

calves liver, thawed, 4 medium tomatoes halved, melted butter, salt, pepper, 8 slices bacon.

Press rounds of eggplant or if mushrooms are used, peel the caps. Brush lamb chops, liver, tomatoes and mushroom caps or rounds of eggplant with butter and sprinkle with salt and pepper. Place on well-heated broiler and broil at high heat. Broiling times: lamb chops, 10 minutes on each side; mushrooms, 5 minutes on each side; eggplant rounds, 6 minutes on each side; tomatoes, 3 minutes on each side; liver and bacon, 2 minutes on each side. Baste with melted butter during broiling. To serve, arrange lamb chop, portion of liver, 2 slices of bacon, 2 tomato halves, and portion of mushrooms or eggplant on plate. Garnish with parsley or watercress.

**BREAKFAST:** Orange and fresh lime juice, scrambled eggs, brown rice muffins, jelly, coffee, milk.

**DINNER:** Spanish fricassee of chicken, mashed potatoes, buttered peas with fresh chopped mint, watercress salad, green apple pie with cheese, coffee, milk.

**SUPPER:** Chicken-tomato bouillon in cups, cold cuts, whole-wheat toast, relishes, celery, radishes and olives, coconut layer cake, fruit bowl, tea, or milk.

### ANGEL FOOD

3 c. egg whites  
1 1/2 c. White Satin granulated sugar  
1/4 c. powdered sugar

Add salt to egg whites and beat until frothy. Add cream of tartar and beat until stiff, but not dry. Sift sugar and flour together three times and add gradually to egg whites. Add lemon juice and one teaspoon vanilla if desired. Bake in angel cake pan about one hour at 275-300 degrees. When done, invert pan and let cool thoroughly before removing from pan. Cut cake through center with a silk thread to form two layers. Frost with filling.

### FILLING

1/4 c. milk  
1/4 c. White Satin sugar  
1 egg yolk, beaten  
1 c. lemon juice  
1 c. or 1 1/2 c. can crushed pineapple, plus or minus cherries.

Dissolve gelatin in 1/4 c. cold water. Cook milk, sugar and egg yolks together in double boiler until it coats the spoon. Remove from heat and stir in gelatin, cool, add pineapple and lemon juice. Whip cream and add when mixture begins to set. Place between layers and over cake.
