

OVER 200 BOY SCOUTS ENJOY SUMMER CAMP

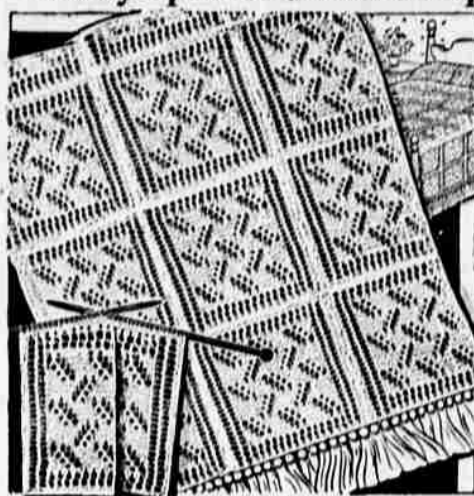

Holman Sees Alloy Bottleneck

GRANTS PASS, Aug. 20 (AP)—Senator Holman said yesterday that a bottleneck in steel might be blamed on a lack of chromite and similar alloys.

Holman made his statement on conclusion of a senate military affairs subcommittee hearing in which miners and engineers told him unexploited deposits of chromite existed in commercial quantities in the west.

The senator flew from Medford at 6 a. m. today to a similar hearing in San Francisco.

First Ascent of Mountain Reported

PRINCE RUPERT, B. C., Aug. 20 (AP)—The first ascent of Mount Meanskinisht, 9200-foot queen of the Seven Sisters range in the northerly Hazelton District of British Columbia, was reported here Monday by Dr. Neal M. Carter, who led a party of four to the summit Aug. 11.

Accompanying Dr. Carter were his wife and Jack Cade and George Baker, all of Prince Rupert. It was the doctor's third try.

NAVY SILK NEEDS ADEQUATE, CLAIM

The navy department has announced that the cutting off of the Japanese silk supply will not create a problem for the navy, and, by the same token, the navy will not be the largest consumer of the silk that formerly went into milady's sheer hose.

In the first place, the navy has enough silk on hand for its current needs, the department has stated.

For three or four years, moreover, it has been experimenting successfully with substitutes and is now prepared to turn out synthetic silk when the need arises.

The artificial material so developed meets the navy's exacting requirements for parachutes, powder bags and other gear very satisfactorily, and, even in small quantities, costs only a few cents more than the 66 cents a yard paid for the silk usually used for parachutes.

The navy consumes between 750,000 and 800,000 yards of parachute silk annually. About 70 yards is required for an airplane pilot's parachute, and 150 yards for a parachute trooper. The extra material is required by the trooper because of the extra equipment he carries.
