land. That's a handy topic to have around any August day. **SUGGESTIONS FOR MAKING MIXED SUMMER DRINKS**

Punch and Judy Bowl (about 6 tall glasses)
Mix one quart bottle carbonated raspberry beverage, 1-pint bottle cranberry juice cocktail, juice from one 8-ounce bottle maraschino cherries, and 1 tablespoon lemon juice. Pour over block of ice or ice cubes. Add maraschino cherries and few sprigs of mint.

Apple Blossom Refresher
Mix equal parts carbonated raspberry beverage and apple juice. Add several sprigs of mint and crush well. Pour over ice cubes and garnish with sprigs of mint.

Summer Frappes (about 6 tall glasses)

Place 1 egg white, unbeaten, one-third cup honey, and 1 teaspoon salt in bowl. Beat with rotary or electric beater about 3 minutes, or until mixture is creamy and stands in soft peaks. Turn into 2-quart jar. Add 1-pint bottle cranberry juice cocktail or prune juice and 3 cups finely crushed ice. Seal tightly and shake vigorously. Serve at once in tall glasses. (If desired, the honey-egg mixture can be whipped in advance and stored in refrigerator until ready to mix.)

CRANBERRY APPLE SALAD

Two cups Dellmooer cranberries, run through food chopper. Add 1 cup White Satin sugar, mix and allow to stand 1 hour.

Dissolve 1 package of orange Jello in 1 1/2 cups boiling water, add 1/2 cup orange juice and the grated rind of 1 orange and 1 large Oregon apple, which has been shredded, and cranberry mixture.

WHITE SATIN SUGAR

Trade Agreement Urged Reopened With Canada

WASHINGTON, Aug. 22 (AP)—Senator Butler (R-Neb) proposed Thursday that negotiations on the trade agreement with Canada be reopened for the purpose of restoring or raising the duty on wheat used for feed.

He wrote Secretary of Agriculture Wickard that "tremendous imports of feed wheat, at the rate of 6,000,000 bushels a year, at a time when there are ample supplies of feed in this country and when warehouses are bulging with the grain surplus, threatening to destroy both the wheat and corn programs entirely."

"If American farmers," the senator continued, "are forbidden to feed even their own surplus wheat to their own stock under penalty of 40 cents a bushel fine, it is impossible to justify giving Canadian farmers part of this market over a tariff of only three cents."

"I suggest that it would be appropriate to place strict quotas, based on figures for the past three years, on imports of wheat for feed."
