Klamath county 4-H club members will be represented at the Pacific International Livestock Exposition in Portland October 4 to 12, by poultry and livestock judging teams, two steers, and 25 fleeces in the wool show. Friday morning at 10 a. m., the poultry judging team, consisting of John McClellan, Charles Thurman and Dexter Sexton, members of the Altamont Cacklers Poultry club, and Taylor High of Olney, who is exhibiting the Angus steer, left with the county club agent.

Sunday morning the livestock judging team, members of the Henley Dairy club, consisting of Jean Keller, Beverly and Buddy Mack, left with Mr. and Mrs. Earl Mack. Albert Christy is the other boy exhibiting a Short-horn steer.

Both calves were to be taken to the show in a trailer, hauled behind the county club agent's car.

According to Clifford Jenkins, club agent, both judging teams will participate in their respective contests on Monday. All delegates will return to Klamath Falls on Wednesday after the fat stock sale, which starts at 10 a. m.

Club members making the trip will have their entire expenses paid as an award for winning the county contests, all expenses to be paid by the county fair board.

Young Frenchman Leads Clemency

VICHY, Unoccupied France, Oct. 3 (AP)—Paul Colette appealed for clemency today to Marshal Petain, the only man who can save the young Norman from a death sentence pronounced by a special French court Wednesday for the attempted assassination of Pierre Laval and Marcel Deat.

Petaim's decision remained undisclosed, but Laval himself was reported drafting a statement asking mercy for Colette, who gravely wounded Laval and Deat at Versailles last August 28.

The court's decision at Paris was announced only this morning.

Doughnut Dish Will Fulfill Wish for Quick Preparation



Toast split cinnamon doughnuts and serve with eggs and bacon.

When unexpected guests arrive, or the boys from camp come home with their soldier friends without advance warning, don't apologize for the food you have on hand. Make the most of that food by serving it simply and well without any attempt to make it look like a dinner planned in advance.

If you have a few cinnamon doughnuts or can get them at the corner grocer's, split them and toast the split side. Top the hot

shortening, 3 egg whites and 1 cup finely cut boiled ham. Sift flour once, measure, add baking powder and salt and sift again. Combine egg yolks, milk and butter; add to flour, beating only until they will hold up in moist peaks. Stir quickly but thoroughly into batter. Bake in hot waffle iron, sprinkling each waffle with 1 cup ham just before closing waffle iron. Serve with heated maple-flavored syrup or with soft scrambled eggs.
