Corvallis Forestry Men Awarded High Grades in Exams

CORVALLIS, Oct. 8 (AP)—Five of the top 15 places in this year's civil service examination for junior foresters were taken by Oregon State college graduates of the school of forestry. From 1500 to 3000 men from forest schools all over the country take

Oregon men in the top group included Owen Cramer, Portland, winner of a scholarship at New York School of Forestry; Don Bauer, Millbrae, Calif., with the U. S. forest service; Bruce Starker, Corvallis, forester with the E. S. Collins estate; Laurence Zach, Mt. Angel, with the U. S. forest service in Idaho; Fred Vogel, teaching forestry at Uni-

versity of Arkansas, and Ray Knudsen, with the U. S. forest service in eastern Oregon.
