

LIBRARY WILL SPONSOR BOOK WEEK CONTEST

In celebration of Book week, November 2 to 8, the county library announces that this year it will stage its fifth annual book mark and poster contest. As in previous years it will be open to students of the rural schools served by the county library.

Book prizes have been won in previous years by students at Merrill, Altamont, Bonanza, Fairhaven, Chiloquin, Beatty, Algoma, Crescent Lake, Poe Valley, Keno, and Lorella schools.

Rules for the contest are as follows:

Contestants — Class A, third and fourth grade students book mark contest; class B, fifth and sixth grade students book mark contest; class C, seventh, eighth and ninth grade students poster contest; class D, tenth, eleventh and twelfth grade students poster contest.

Book marks and posters are to be turned in at Klamath county library by 5 o'clock on Saturday of book week, November 8.

Subject matter — The theme for book week this year is "Forward with Books." The book marks and posters should carry out this idea.

Points for judging — Subject matter (50). Is it suitable for a book mark or poster? Does it tell the story of reading good books? Workmanship (50). Lettering, harmony and balance of color (black and white are acceptable), harmony and balance of design, neatness, originality.

A book will be given to the winner in each of the four divisions. Book marks and posters from the county will be placed in the chamber of commerce window at Klamath Falls following the contest.

Copies of book marks made in previous years may be seen at the county library.

PENDARVIS MUSIC DATE CANCELLED

CITIES NAMED IN SAFETY CONTEST

Bend, La Grande, Burns and Myrtle Point continued to hold the lead in the four divisions of the 1941 Oregon Cities Traffic Safety contest at the end of the first eight months of this year, it was announced today by Earl Snell, secretary of state and sponsor of the contest. All four cities were in first place the previous month also.

Standings in the contest are based on the current improvement or lack of improvement shown in comparison with the normal accident expectancy as computed from the accident experience for the preceding three years for each city. Thus each city competes against its own record and the ones making the best showing are rated highest.

Following are the cities in the four divisions, listed in order of their standings at the end of the eight months:

First Division—Bend, Klamath Falls, Salem, Portland, Medford, Astoria, Eugene.

Second Division—La Grande, Marshfield, Oregon City, Corvallis, Pendleton, Baker, Albany, Grants Pass, The Dalles.

Third Division—Burns, Tillamook, Roseburg, Silverton, Hood River, Newberg, St. Helens, Forest Grove, Toledo, Ontario, McMinnville, North Bend, Cottage Grove, Springfield, Hillsboro, Dallas, Lakeview, Newport, West Linn, Coquille, Seaside, Lebanon and Prineville.

Fourth Division—Myrtle Point, Union, Woodburn, Stayton, Independence, Milton, Bandon, Nyssa, Enterprise, Oswego, Redmond, Rainier, Reedsport, Sheridan, West Salem, Beaverton, Heppner, Junction City, Gresham, Mt. Angel, Vale, Vernonia, Gladstone, Warrenton, Milwaukie, Sweet Home.

Although there were fewer school days in September this year than last, circulation reports coming in to the county library show an increase in the number of books read.

Main elementary school children took out three times as many books from their school library as they did the first month of school last year. Merrill elementary school almost doubled its circulation. Bonanza, Henley, and Keno high schools also showed increases in school library circulation.

400 Houses to Be Built at Portland

PORTLAND, Oct. 14 (AP)—Construction of 400 permanent-type houses for Portland industrial workers will start by December 1, two defense housing officials predicted yesterday.

Hot Springs Water Reservoir Being Cleaned, Painted
