

RATIONING OF POWER SET IN SOUTH STATES

WASHINGTON, Oct. 31 (AP)—The OPM Thursday ordered emergency power rationing in seven southeastern states effective November 10, and immediate discontinuance of power for such purposes as sign and show window lighting, flood-lighting athletic fields and theater marquees in these states.

The November 10 date depends on whether or not heavy rains fall in the territory. The limitations on non-essential uses are effective regardless of whether rain fills power reservoirs. The program is designed to guarantee full and uninterrupted defense plant production in the southeast despite the power shortage there, and calls for immediate compulsory pooling of power by a grid of 40 publicly and privately owned power companies in 13 states.

The OPM order requires a 30 per cent reduction of power used by large commercial and industrial consumers in Alabama, Georgia, Tennessee, eastern Mississippi, northwest Florida, and southeastern South Carolina, including Charleston.

A 5 per cent reduction was ordered in North Carolina and most of South Carolina. First government venture into power allocation, the rationing order exempts vital defense industries and other fulfilling essential civilian services. It will not affect the small residential or commercial user except that he may not use power for the forbidden purposes.

The order does apply, however, to every non-exempt consumer who used more than 10,000 kilowatt hours of electricity in the month for which his meter was read between September 15 and October 14.

Pay Check Received After 38-Year Wait

EAST ST. LOUIS, Ill., Oct. 31 (UP)—Richard Grady, 73-year-old retired railroad clerk, received a \$29.03 paycheck from the Illinois Central railroad today — 38 years late.

Grady worked as a laborer for the railroad for 15 days in 1903. But when he started for the paycar to collect his money, high water kept him from the tracks. Four days later when he could reach the tracks, the paycar had been moved.

He attempted to collect from the railroad but had lost his claim ticket for the money and didn't get the check. Last summer, after he had retired, he had an attorney write the railroad. A checkup on the books showed he never was paid and the check was drawn up.

CHICKEN AND OYSTER PIE (Serves 6)

Three cups cooked chicken (cut in pieces), 1 pint (12) raw oysters, 2 shelled hard-cooked eggs, sliced, 1 cup finely minced celery, 2 cups well-seasoned chicken broth, 4 tablespoons flour, 6 tablespoons water, baking powder biscuit dough, 2 tablespoons melted butter, paprika.

Arrange the chicken, cleaned oysters, eggs, and celery in alternate layers in a 1½ quart casserole. Meanwhile heat the chicken broth, stir in the flour mixed to a smooth paste with water, and boil five minutes, stirring. Pour this sauce over chicken.

Prepare baking powder biscuit dough, using 2 cups flour. Roll into a rectangle 1 inch thick, brush with melted butter, and sprinkle generously with paprika. Roll as a jelly roll, then cut into crosswise slices 1 inch thick. Arrange over the pie, cut side down, and bake in a hot oven of 425 degrees F. for 40 minutes.

dish comes from the collection of Carolyn Willyoung Stagg. **HAM POTATO SUPPER DISH** Use enough hot mashed potatoes to nearly fill baking dish. Season highly and add 1 pound finely chopped cooked ham; 2 tablespoons chopped green pepper, 1 onion, chopped.

Beat until very light and bake in buttered casserole until brown crust begins to form. Then make indentations in top with spoon and drop in as many eggs as are needed. Bake until eggs are set.
