

350 GIRLS TO RECEIVE 'GIVE SERVICE' PINS

"Give Service" pins have recently been awarded to 307,000 Camp Fire girls throughout the country in appreciation of the tremendous amount of help they have already given, and as a reminder to watch for the new contributions which they may make to their homes, community and nation.

Approximately 350 local Camp Fire girls will be presented these significant pins by Elizabeth Baker, Red Cross executive, Sergeant Carl Cook of the U. S. Marines, Mrs. Percy Murray, president of the Camp Fire council, and Mrs. Loren Palmerton, chairman of the Guardians association. Phyllis Smith, who has been a registered Camp Fire girl for eight consecutive years, will respond for the girls.

The colorful ceremony, which is open to the public, will take place in the Fremont school, Friday, November 7 at 7:30 p. m.

As they receive the attractive red, white and blue pins, the young people will pledge themselves to "seek new opportunities for service to home, community, country and the world." In this spoken pledge they will express the hope that "through cheerful and efficient service," they may become better citizens.

The idea of giving service is not at all new to Camp Fire girls, explained Mrs. John Kennedy. She pointed out that "Give Service" has always been an important part of Camp Fire law, and that in this time of great emergency, the girls are especially eager to do their share towards national defense and war relief. The privilege of wearing a "Give Service" pin will be an inspiration to each girl as she does her share to meet the urgent need. New members of the Camp Fire girls who have joined during the current membership drive will also be awarded pins at the ceremony.

Wide awake Camp Fire girls are making many varied contributions to national preparedness. The service is given joyfully and is combined with good times. These young people have earned the honor of wearing "Give Service" pins by doing such jobs as raveling old sweaters, washing the wool and reknitting it into squares and clothes for the Red Cross. They have made a fine showing in the

nation-wide drive to collect aluminum for our defense program, and they also have been busy collecting soap, tinfoil, buttons and scraps of cloth for British war relief. Not forgetting selectees in the army camps, the girls are rounding up old books and magazines to supply the soldiers with plenty of reading matter.

Home service is a vital part of the Camp Fire program. By sewing, washing, cooking and taking care of the younger children, the girls are able to give their parents more time off for valuable community defense work. Realizing the leading role that nutrition plays in the total defense picture, the Camp Fire organization this year will stress a survey of nutrition problems. In every Camp Fire home across the United States the girls are helping to see that their own family eats well-balanced and health building meals. In this very practical way they can aid in making our country strong.

Defendant Found Insane in 'Mercy' Slaying Trial

CHEHALIS, Nov. 6 (P)—A superior court jury here last night found James Russell, 20, not guilty by reason of insanity in the slaying of his 14-year-old brother, but also decided Russell was still insane.

James shot his brother Danny, an epileptic, last July 4 and told authorities he did so because he felt his brother was incurable.

He appeared unmoved as the verdict was read, an attitude which has characterized his conduct throughout the entire three-day trial. The jury was out just five hours, returning its verdict at 11:15 p. m.

Before retiring, the jury had heard Dr. Errol Carlson, a Tacoma psychiatrist, describe the defendant as a schizophrenic with likely-to-be-repeated homicidal tendencies.

Dr. Carlson said Russell had a 5 to 20 per cent chance of cure if given proper treatment but until a cure is effected he should not be released.
