17 Hurt as Three Buses, Truck Pile Up on Bay Bridge

SAN FRANCISCO, Nov. 6 (AP)—Seventeen persons were hurt in a freak traffic accident on the San Francisco-Oakland bridge yesterday involving three buses and a truck.

Bus passengers reported a Greyhound bus was apparently stalled on the lower three-lane ramp of the bridge in a thick fog during the early morning rush hour when another Greyhound rammed into the rear of it. A key system commuter bus hit the rear of the second Greyhound and a truck rammed into the key bus.

The series of rear-end collisions left no one seriously injured, highway patrolmen reported. All were coming towards San Francisco.

Traffic on the lower deck of the seven mile bridge was jammed for more than an hour.

Ambulances from Berkeley, San Francisco and the naval receiving ship on Yuerba Buena Island were sent to the scene.

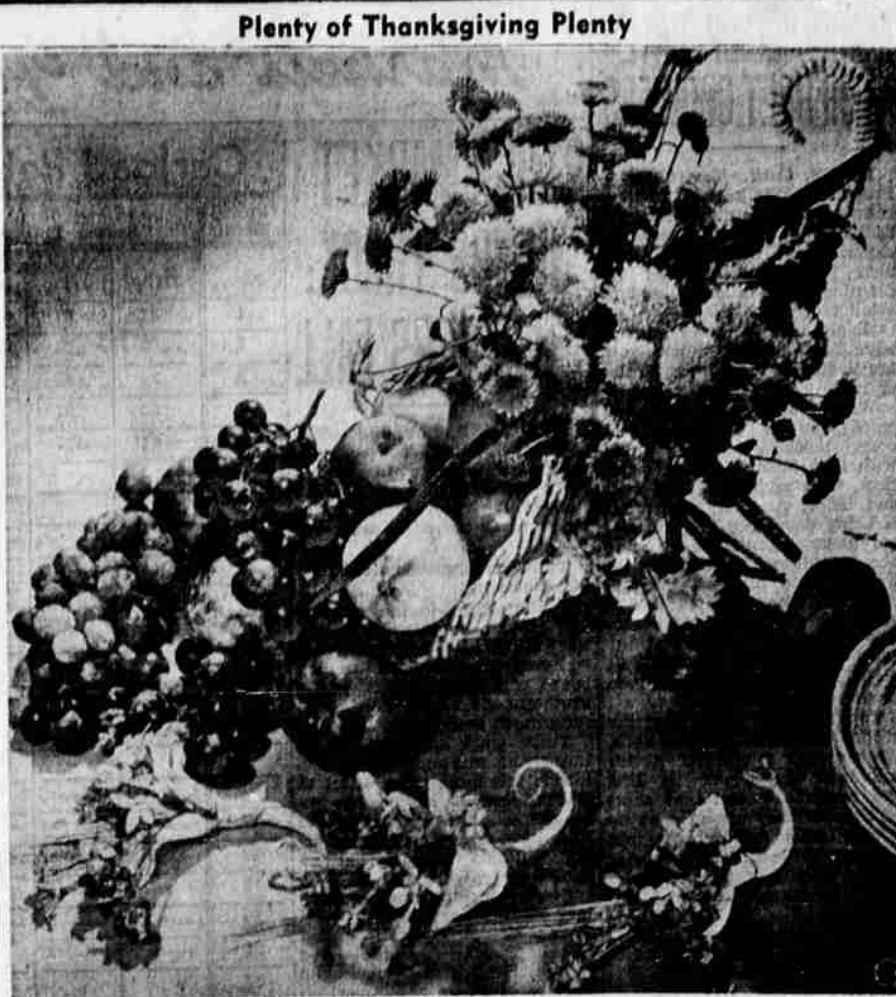
The pig's appendix this season augured moderate weather up to the holidays, then a very severe two months.

"Proportionate Makeup" Adjusts Feature Defects

Now the glamor-capital says: "Proportionate makeup." Perc Westmore, one of Hollywood's makeup authorities, says the key to correct use of cosmetics is not only the shape of your face, but the distances between features.

The perfectly proportioned face, says Westmore, has the following relationships among features:

1. Brow is as wide as the span of index finger, middle finger and forefinger of the right hand.
2. Eyebrows are above the eye a distance just about equal to the height of the whole eye when it is opened normally.
3. Eyes are just about as far apart (measuring from inside corner to inside corner) as the length of one eye.
4. The corners of the mouth, when the beauty smiles her broadest, should be on a line with the pupils of the eyes.

Of course, Hollywood's stars are the best assurance that you needn't get excited if your face doesn't show these ideal dimensions. For few indeed are the real glamor queens whose faces match the theoretical ideal.

IMPERFECTION HAS GLAMOR

There can be a certain attraction in imperfection—if you doubt it, compare the actuality of your favorite star's facial proportions with this ideal!

However, if you have a feature that's way out of line, you can fix it with the aid of the scale given above. For instance, mascara applied only at the outer

corners of the eyes will make them look longer. You will be surprised how strong an illusion you can create by skillful use of cosmetics.

Milk Important As Part Of Menu for Every Day

Milk is such a valuable food that it's important to find pleasant ways to include it in each day's menu. For each child, try to get at least 1½ pints a day and a quart if possible; for each adult a pint or more, and for pregnant or nursing mothers, a full quart. That's the health defense rule every housewife must follow.

Try adding orange juice to your egg nog recipe. This insures the children's getting their egg, milk and citrus fruit all in one drink. Cream soups make a delicious main dish for luncheon and corn chowder (made with evaporated milk if you wish) is an excellent way to use up the corn left over from yesterday's dinner.

Speaking of left-overs—here's a recipe for a pork and veal loaf in which you can use the remainder of Sunday's roast.

PORK AND VEAL LOAF

(Six Servings)
One-half pound ground veal, 1 pound ground pork (2 cups), ½ cup cracker crumbs, ½ teaspoon salt, ½ teaspoon pepper, 1½ teaspoons sage, 2 eggs, 2 tablespoons milk, 1 tablespoon butter, melted.

Mix meat, cracker crumbs, salt, pepper and sage together lightly. Beat egg, milk and butter together; add to meat mixture. Shape in greased medium-sized loaf pan and bake in moderate oven (350 degrees F.) for 1 hour and 15 minutes or until well done throughout and nicely browned on the outside.

We are always looking for new ways to "pep-up" the root vegetables which are so cheap to buy and so necessary in our diet from a nutritional standpoint.

TURNIPS WITH GREEN PEPPER DRESSING

(Six Servings)

Three cups turnips, diced, boiling water, 5 tablespoons butter, 1 teaspoon salt.

Place boiling water in saucepan and drop turnips into water; cover; boil gently for 15 to 20 minutes or until tender. Drain and add butter and salt. Serve with green pepper dressing.

GREEN PEPPER DRESSING

(Six Servings)
Two tablespoons butter, 1 tablespoon flour, ½ cup milk, ½ cup grated onion, 1 cup green

pepper, chopped; 4 tablespoons water.

Melt butter and add flour; add top milk and cook in saucepan for 15 minutes, stirring constantly. Cook onion and pepper in water for 5 minutes; add to white sauce. Pour over the turnips and serve.

MENU

BREAKFAST—Stewed prunes (cook with lemon), cream of wheat, wholewheat toast, coffee, milk.

LUNCHEON—Corn chowder, hot cloverleaf rolls, stewed peaches, apple butter cake, orange egg nog.

DINNER—Pork and veal loaf, fried potato patties, turnips with green pepper dressing, grapefruit salad, chocolate bread pudding, coffee.

NEWEST TAX PLAN AFFECTS INCOMES

WASHINGTON, Nov. 6, (UP)

A married man with no dependents who makes \$50 a week would find, roughly, \$4.67 deducted from his pay check for federal taxes every week, under the new \$4,800,000,000 revenue program proposed by the treasury Thursday night.

The program provides that normal personal exemptions would be deducted before the proposed new at-the-source income tax is computed.

So the \$50-a-weeker who enjoys a \$1500 personal exemption because of his married status, would find that the exemption figured to \$28.85 weekly. That would leave \$21.15 a week subject to tax. If the treasury's suggested 15 per cent rate is adopted, that would be a tax of \$3.17 a week.

Then he also would have deducted a flat 3 per cent for social security taxes, under the treasury plan. Computed on the whole \$50 a week that would amount to \$1.50.

And the \$50-a-weeker would find only \$45.33 in his weekly check.

Also he still would have to pay the normal income tax, but before paying this would be able to deduct the amount taken from his salary to pay the 15 per cent at source income levy.

OREGON 13TH FOR INCREASED JOBS

SALEM, Nov. 6 (AP)—Finding permanent jobs for 11,000 persons during September, Oregon ranked thirteenth among the 48 states, while it ranked 38th in the amount of jobless benefits paid, the state unemployment compensation commission said today.

During the first nine months of 1941, Oregon's unemployed received \$2,114,800 in benefits, a decrease of 39 per cent from the similar period last year. Benefits in Washington and California dropped 40 and 16 per cent, respectively.

The only western and southern states which ranked ahead of Oregon in job-placing were California, Texas and Missouri. Many other states with less population are paying more benefits than Oregon.
