FIGURES GIVEN ON PAY FOR JOBLESS

SALEM, Nov. 10 — Oregon's unemployed have drawn in benefits exactly half of the contributions made by employers since the state law went into effect nearly six years ago.

This was strikingly shown this week when the commission's deposit of \$16,260,000 with the federal government exactly equalled the total amount withdrawn for benefits. Later, other contributions came in to boost the fund to \$16,415,000, an all-time high and about six and a half million above the same date last year.

Although the "6 per cent ceiling" may be increased nearly a million dollars from the \$14,373,500 now in effect, officials anticipate that the size of the fund will be well over the new mark on December 31, 1941, and probably throughout 1942. Unless the fund falls below the new "ceiling" of about \$15,400,000 employers will pay no penalty rates next year.

The unemployment commission this year has received \$8,560,433 in taxes and interest as compared with \$6,925,753 for all of 1940. Benefits to the jobless have amounted to \$2,206,844 in 1941 as compared with \$4,099,925 for all of last year.

STOCK MARKET PRICES WILTED BY SKEPTICISM

NEW YORK, Nov. 10 (AP) — The stock market today was an island surrounded almost entirely by skepticism and prices generally wilted from lack of bidding sustenance.

Sizable blocks of N. Y. Central and standard brands—from 1000 to 12,000 shares—apparently liquidation for the purpose of establishing income tax credits, helped give the session a show of activity. Transfers were around 600,000 shares.

Pleasant dividends and earnings statements, brokers said, were more than offset as market factors by persistent doubts about taxes, labor and revived uneasiness over the far eastern picture.

Bethlehem steel hit a new low for the year and U. S. Steel was a backslider as this week's mill operations were estimated off 1.6 points of 96.6 per cent of capacity.

Stocks in low ground for 1941 included Consolidated Edison, N. Y. Central, Montgomery Ward and Caterpillar Tractor. Backward were Chrysler, U. S. Rubber, Santa Fe, Allied Chemical, Johns-Manville, U. S. Gypsum and Woolworth.

SMALL GAINS MADE IN GRAIN MARKET

CHICAGO, Nov. 10 (AP) — Wheat prices tacked on small net gains at times today in a listless pre-holiday trade but corn and soybeans eased lower due partly to belief that better harvesting weather should lead to increased receipts of these commodities.

Wheat derived some support from latest government figures showing recent lending operations have been on a large scale and from Canadian export sales of 2,000,000 bushels to Great Britain. The amount of 1941 wheat now stored under loans is estimated at more than 300,000,000 bushels, largest on record.

Wheat closed unchanged to 1 cent higher compared with Saturday, December \$1.16 1/2. May \$1.21 1/2. After dropping 1/2 to 1 cent, corn rallied to close unchanged to 1 cent higher. December 77 1/2 cents, May 83 1/2 cents. Soybeans, which showed losses of 1-1 1/2 cents at one time closed 1 cent lower to 1 cent higher; oats unchanged to 1 cent off; rye 1 cent lower.
