

BUBONIC PLAGUE SURVEY PRAISED

SACRAMENTO, Nov. 18 (UP)—Importance of continuation of rodent plague surveys was stressed Saturday by Dr. Bertram P. Brown, state director of public health in a report to Gov. Culbert Olson on the bubonic plague situation in Siskiyou county where the disease claimed two lives last summer.

Surveys by the state bureau of sanitary inspections still are underway and plans are to continue them indefinitely, Brown said.

"It is important that there be no relaxation of effort until the situation is brought under complete control," the director cautioned.

A total of 258 locations have been investigated in the county. 3128 animals taken for specimens and 42,891 fleas collected. Brown said bubonic plague had been demonstrated in five squirrels and 24 "pools" of fleas.

In addition, 17 plague concentrations have been located.

In one instance, the director reported, 800 fleas infected with bubonic plague were combed from one sick squirrel.

He recommended that:

1. Intensive rodent control activities be conducted on all known plague concentrations and surrounding areas and that all burrows in such areas, where possible, be gassed and closed to a depth of not less than 12 inches to prevent escape.

2. In areas close to human habitation, in addition to destruction of rodents, buildings should be made rat-proof; that all harboring and breeding places be removed and great care be taken in storing and disposing of materials on which rodents feed.

3. Garbage dumps be burned over or covered with earth to prevent harboring or breeding of rodents; that such places be kept well poisoned.

4. Squirrel free zones be established around all centers of population with particular reference to school and army camps.

GOLD RECEIVED AT MINT IN DENVER

DENVER, Nov. 18 (AP)—The first shipment of \$650,000,000 worth of gold being transferred from San Francisco was delivered Monday to the Denver mint under a guard of soldiers, policemen, and postal inspectors.

When the transfer is completed in the next three weeks, gold in storage at the Denver mint will total \$5,100,000,000, largest single store in the world except that held in vaults at Fort Knox, Ky.

The gold is shipped in the form of gold bricks, weighing about 2,000 ounces and worth \$35,000. Each brick is contained in a registered mail sack.

Officials said the bricks would be without value to any individual because they contain small amounts of a material that would identify them as stolen.

Young Republicans To Convene at Eugene December 6

SALEM (Nov. 18 (AP))—The Oregon young republican federation, which meets at Eugene December 6, will hear a panel discussion on international relations conducted by Dean Victor Morris of the University of Oregon the federation's executive committee decided at a meeting here yesterday.

Candidates for the federation presidency will include Adam Leflore, Eugene, now treasurer; and Carl Francis, Dayton, secretary.

The executive committee made plans for support of republican candidates after the primary election next May.

At the federation convention, each county will have at least 10 delegates, with an additional delegate for each 10 members in excess of 100. More than 500 delegates are expected to attend.

Handsomeness Array for a Holiday--Vegetable Tray

As nationally known director of New York's Official Consumers' Bureau of Department of Markets, Mrs. Frances Foley Gannon goes 100 per cent old-fashioned on Thanksgiving. "Yes, the heavy family traditional meal for us. I know that's contrary to modern nutrition, but for one day in the year I do not practice what I preach. I'm serving my children and my grandchildren this huge old-fashioned dinner," she says.

"Clear soup first, instead of a fruit cocktail, then turkey, bread stuffing, dry and delicately seasoned turkey, the turkey flavor will have a chance. Also old-fashioned turnips, white potatoes and boiled onions, pumpkin pie and ice cream."

This thoroughly modern adviser on family food purchases uses fall fruits, no flowers, for her Thanksgiving table. They include pears, a pineapple, red apples, grapes and plums.

A tray of traditional vegetables with slight variation would be both old-fashioned and different. Use a large metal tray well warmed. In the center place a Hubbard squash shell filled with candied squash. Around it arrange creamed onions, broiled tomatoes with mushroom caps and steamed broccoli. Serve Hollandaise sauce for broccoli in separate bowl.

Candied Hubbard Squash Split large Hubbard squash, scoop out, leaving green shell. Cut squash meat into large

Watercress Stuffing
(For 15-pound turkey)
One cup butter or drippings, 6 tablespoons diced onion, 1 cup diced celery, 2 1/2 cups finely cut watercress, 7 1/2 cups soft, enriched bread crumbs, 1 1/2 teaspoons salt, 1/2 teaspoon black pepper.

Melt butter in a glass saucepan; add onion and celery and cook about 3 to 4 minutes over moderate direct heat. Add watercress and cook about 5 minutes longer. Pour over bread crumbs, mixing all the while. Add salt and pepper. Mix lightly but thoroughly with two forks.

And perhaps Mr. Wallace, our former secretary of agriculture, would recommend this old-fashioned dessert for Thanksgiving this year to help salvage the storm-damaged apple crop in areas affected by recent high winds.

PORTLAND, Nov. 18 (AP)—The crest of a spent Willamette river flood neared Portland today with rivermen predicting that channel walls would hold it.

The river neared flood stage at Albany, covered low farms and blocked the secondary Corvallis-Albany road. Damage was slight, however, and the Pacific highway between the two towns remained open.
