Luisetti Leads Quintet in Hoop Victory in New York

NEW YORK, Nov. 20 (UP)—The incomparable Hank Luisetti, former Stanford University all-American basketball star, Wednesday night came back to Madison Square garden, scene of some of his greatest collegiate triumphs—and led the Phillips 66 quintet of Bartlesville, Okla., to an easy 39-25 triumph over the Ohio State A. A. Metropolitan champions, in the feature game of a doubleheader here.

Twentieth Century Fox, National AAU champions, defeated Roanoke Legionnaires, 35-28 in the first game.

Northwest Circuit Title Settled Today As Whitman Faces 'Cats

The northwest conference football championship will be settled at Walla Walla today where undefeated Whitman entertains the high-scoring Willamette university Bearcats.

Whitman is undefeated both in and out of the conference this year, while Willamette has lost but one tilt, a non-conference shellacking meted by the University of Idaho.

Willamette has rolled up 190 points to seven for the Bearcats' four conference victims, and was a heavy favorite to trample the doughty Missionaries, who have scored 47 points and yielded 28 in their four triumphs.

TACOMA, Nov. 20 (AP)—Marv Tommervik will have full charge of Pacific Lutheran's patched-up forces when they meet Portland university's Pilots at the stadium tomorrow night—in what may be the fiercest grid fight seen here in years.

Coach Cliff Olson announced that the Tommygun will be game captain and signal caller in the absence of Capt. Marvel Harshman, who probably will see the game only from a seat on the bench.

Harshman, walking for the first time in a week, was anxious to get into a suit yesterday, but Olson pondered the climax game with the College of Pacific next week and shook his head at the prospects of big Harsh going in against Portland.

Santa Barbara, Beats College Of Pacific, 7-6

SANTA BARBARA, Calif., Nov. 20 (UP)—A strong Santa Barbara State college football team staged a third period rally to upset the College of Pacific squad, 7 to 6, at La Playa field here, Wednesday night.

The College of Pacific eleven dominated the first half and scored in the second period when Halfback Keith Slaughter passed 15 yards to Clint Ward in the end zone. Brown failed to make the conversion good.

In the third period Santa Barbara set the proteges of Coach Amos Alonzo Stagg on their heels when Gaucho Captain Ernie Saenz tossed a 30-yard pass to End Howard Karjala on Pacific's five yard marker. Fullback Saenz took the ball over for a touchdown on the next play and then made a successful conversion.

FOREST GROVE, Ore., Nov. 20 (UP)—The Pacific University football team came from behind here Wednesday to win a Thanksgiving eve grid clash from St. Martin's college of Washington, 20-19. The Pacific eleven was trailing at halftime, 19-7, but went back to shut out the northern team while running up 13 points.

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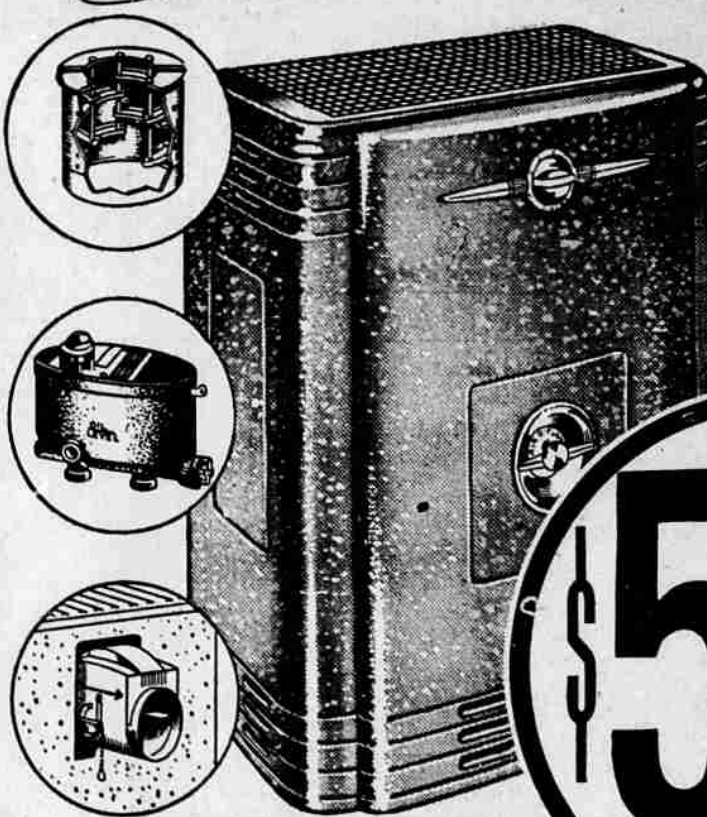
