

BEET GROWERS TO MEET AT TULELAKE

A meeting of growers and prospective growers of sugar beets will be held in the Legion hall at Tulelake Friday at 8 p. m. when a representative of the Spreckels Sugar company will explain the 1942 contract.

Only 1100 acres of sugar beets were allowed in production last year in the Tule lake area although farmers applied for 3000 acres. Government restrictions have been removed this year and it is expected other farmers will seek to establish acreage history in sugar beets.

Acreage history is a determining factor in the allotments under restricted production. Four years of raising sugar beets in the Tule lake area have proved the crop is practical there, according to the Spreckels company.

FAIRVIEW

Dr. Erna Gordon of Portland, international relations field worker in Oregon for United China relief, addressed a highly appreciative audience at the Fairview school Tuesday afternoon, when the Fairview PTA held its November meeting. The Rev. Victor Phillips of the First Methodist church, Klamath county chairman for United China relief, introduced Dr. Gordon who is considered one of the foremost and best informed women speakers in the state.

The business meeting opened at 2:30 o'clock with Mrs. James Hill presiding. Mrs. L. E. Juniper, program chairman, led the group in the flag salute, and presented Della Webber, music chairman, who accompanied her girls' trio in two vocal numbers. The trio is composed of Roberta Pugh, Marie Boldischar and Dorothy Dewey. An appropriate invocation was given by the president, Mrs. Hill.

It was reported that Stephen Mosher's room had won the award in the PTA's successful membership contest held this fall. The third grade room won the attendance award for Tuesday's meeting.

Committee reports included the reading of an article wherein Mrs. J. K. Sayre of Portland, state membership chairman, states that membership in the Oregon Congress of Parents and Teachers has reached a total of 23,183 men and women, or 7774 above the enrollment for the same time last year. Congress leaders are confident of reaching an all-time high before close of the current year which ends next March, according to Mrs. Sayre. Mrs. Frank Blum of Portland, state president, says "They feel that the Parent-Teacher organization's vigorous insistence that its job in the national defense program is largely the re-education of essential services in education, health and recreation, for the nation's children, may be one impelling reason for the growth."

Stephen Mosher, safety chairman, spoke of the splendid improvements in the city, mentioning particularly the installation of stop lights and the establishing of the "law-breakers' school." He concluded by giving eight points dealing with safety in the home.

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Camp-Going Cake for Khaki-Clads Is Nutty

Even the best soldiers are cake-eaters, especially when the cake comes out of the family kitchen. Here's a good one, and it will keep fresh no matter how far it must travel.

CAMP-GOING CAKE

Juice of 1 orange, water, grated rind of 1 orange, 2 cups seeded raisins, 1 cup brown sugar, 3 squares chocolate, 2 cups flour, 1 teaspoon baking powder, 1 teaspoon soda, 1 teaspoon salt, 1 teaspoon cinnamon, 1 cup toasted Brazil nuts rolled fine.

Add sufficient water to orange juice to make 1 cup. Add grated rind, raisins, brown sugar and chocolate, simmer together 3 minutes, stirring until chocolate is dissolved. Cool. Sift together all remaining ingredients except Brazil nuts; add to cooled chocolate mixture. Add Brazil nuts and mix well. Bake in long narrow loaf pan or in two medium-sized loaf pans in slow oven (325 deg. F.) for 1 to 1 1/2 hours, until baked through.

To Toast and Roll Brazil Nuts: Heat oven to moderate temperature (350 deg. F.). Spread out shelled Brazil nuts on baking sheet or in shallow pan and allow to toast for 15 to 18 minutes. Remove from oven, cool, and crush with a rolling pin (press down on them gently at first to crush, then roll). Toasting gives a special flavor.

MINCEMEAT DROP COOKIES (Make 24 Dozen)

One-quarter cup shortening, 1 cup sugar, 1 egg, 1 cup mince-meat, 1 1/2 cups sifted flour, 2 teaspoons phosphate baking powder, 1 teaspoon salt.

Cream shortening, add sugar gradually, creaming until light and fluffy. Add egg and beat well. Fold in mince-meat. Sift flour, baking powder and salt together and add to creamed mixture, stirring until well blended. Drop by teaspoonfuls on greased baking sheet and bake in moderately hot oven (400 deg. F.) about 10 minutes.

MENU

BREAKFAST: Baked apples, parsley omelet, whole-wheat toast, coffee, milk.

LUNCHEON: Cream of potato soup, hard enriched rolls, sliced oranges and bananas, oatmeal cookies, tea, milk.

DINNER: Creamed codfish with hard-cooked eggs on toasted English muffins, parsley potatoes, broccoli, mince-meat drop cookies, fruit bowl, coffee, milk.

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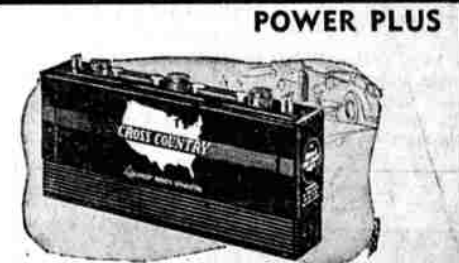
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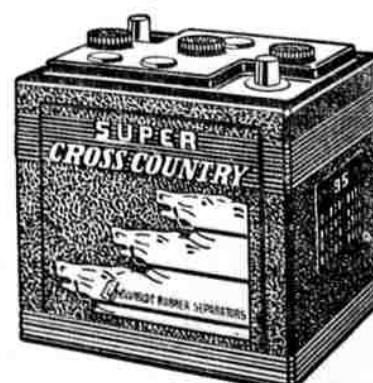
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
