SACRAMENTO, Nov. 28 (P)-Postponement of the opening of bids for construction of additionai facilities in connection with the Shasta dam fish conservation program was announced by the US bureau of reclamation today The bureau was scheduled to

open bids today for building a hatchery on Battle creek in southern Shasta county, and other offers tomorrow for an adja cent warehouse and garage. Pro-posals for both projects will be opened December 8 instead.

Bureau officials said the postponement was due to a change in the wage scale effecting an in-crease in pay for carpenters who will be employed in the con-struction. At the same time, they announced bids will be opened December 18 for six resi-

dences at the hatchery site.

The fish control program is designed to provide salmon a "detour" to an insurmountable obstacle-Shasta dam itself-to their annual migration from the Pacific ocean to the upper reaches of the Sacramento river and tributary streams.

Losses during 1940 totaled only \$450,561.



Mix meat and bread crumbs thoroughly. Add onions, season with salt and pepper to taste. Form into small balls and fry in butter until brown. Add cup of boiling water and allow to simmer 10 minutes.
