# WHEAT BIDS RALLY IN CLOSING PERIOD

CHICAGO, Dec. 5 (P)-Wheat soybean and other grain prices sagged fractions to more than a today but then rallied to close with net gains in most cases.

Continuation of profit taking caused the early retreat. Later, mill buying, partly associated with substantial flour sales to eastern bakers, helped to rally wheat, while corn and oats re-flected good demand for cash grain and further large sales of grain to be shipped eastward from Chicago.

Wheat closed ic lower to ic higher, December \$1.178-3, May \$1.228-3; corn i-ic down, December 753c, May 818-1c; oats ilic higher; rye I-ic lower; soy beans 1-11c higher.
