

### Mulligatawny--You Don't Sing It, You Eat It

Ellen Ballou, Canadian content plant, lived for many years in London. She now makes her permanent home in the United States and says that her favorite Canadian and English dishes are served in many American restaurants, cooked excellently. Miss Ballou's own family recipes for typically British food, with a slight American accent, include three favorite dishes.

#### BAKED CANADIAN BACON

(Serves 4 to 6)  
One-half cup brown sugar, 2 pounds unsliced Canadian bacon, 1 teaspoon dry mustard, 1/2 cup pineapple juice.

Mix thoroughly sugar, mustard and fruit juice. Spread evenly over meat. Bake in a moderately slow oven without a cover for 1 hour. Baste every 1 hour. If desired, place slices of pineapple in pan 15 minutes before roast is finished and sprinkle with a little sugar. Serve hot surrounded with glazed pineapple slices.

#### MULLIGATAWNY SOUP

(Serves 4 to 6)  
One and one-half pounds mutton, 2 large onions, 2 carrots, 1 small white turnip, 1 bayleaf, parsley, thyme, 1 1/2 tablespoons flour, 1 tablespoon curry powder, 4 cups of stock and 4 cups of water (or 8 cups of water), 3 tablespoons lemon juice, salt.  
Slice vegetable and fry in fat until lightly browned, add meat which has been cut into small cubes. Fry lightly. Sprinkle with

flour and curry powder. Stir well, add stock and water, bring to a quick boil. Skim thoroughly. Add herbs and seasoning, simmer over a low flame for 3 hours. Strain. Add meat cubes to clear liquid, bring to a boil, add lemon juice. Simmer for 5 minutes. Serve with steamed rice.

#### ENGLISH TEA BISCUIT

Sift together: 3 cups flour, 1/2 teaspoon soda, 1 teaspoon nutmeg, 1 cup butter, 3 cups sugar, 1 egg cream, 3 eggs beaten slightly. Blend butter into the flour. Add eggs and cream and knead into a smooth dough. Roll thin and cut into large round cakes. Bake at 400 degrees F. until light brown.

#### MENU

**BREAKFAST:** Stewed prunes in orange juice, oatmeal, toast, jelly, coffee, milk.  
**LUNCHEON:** Tomato Juice, scrambled eggs with left-over vegetables, wholewheat toast, baked apples, tea, milk.

**DINNER:** Mulligatawny soup, steamed brown rice, lettuce and green pepper salad, steamed marmalade pudding, foamy lemon sauce, coffee, milk.

### Lamb Auctioned for \$1.75 per Pound

LOS ANGELES, Dec. 5 (AP)—So you think meat prices are high?

The grand champion lamb of the Great Western Livestock show—an 89-pound Southdown owned by Howard Vaughn of Dixon, Calif. —was auctioned Thursday for \$156.75, or nearly \$1.75 per pound.

Great Western official said this established a world record. The previous high listed was \$1.10 a pound, paid last month in San Francisco.

But other records showed \$2 a pound was paid in 1928 for a champion lamb at Chicago. Chops from the champ would bring \$15 a pound at retail.

Breeding champions included: Aberdeen Angus Junior; Guttridge 100th, John F. Guttridge, Prairie City, Ore.
