SENATORS MAY EASE HOUSE STRIKE BILL

WASHINGTON, Dec. 6 (AP) — Influential forces in the senate campaigned today to replace the drastic house-approved strike curb bill with a milder measure next week.

There were strong indications that the senate labor committee might retain only the title of the house bill, sponsored by Rep. Smith (D-Va.), and substitute for its contents a much less sweeping contract system proposed by Senator Norris (Ind.-Neb.).

The Smith bill, approved by the house Wednesday, would require secret balloting before strikes could be called, would outlaw sympathy and jurisdictional strikes, require registration of unions, ban picket line violence, and establish the defense mediation board as a statutory agency.

Calling a closed session of the labor committee for Monday morning, Chairman Thomas (D-Utah) told reporters he personally was opposed to holding hearings on the Smith measure.

LAKEVIEW YOUTH SLAIN IN QUARREL

Edward Colts Killed By Stabbing; Mill Worker Held

LAKEVIEW, Ore., Dec. 6 (Special) — Eddie Colts, 19, was fatally stabbed here last night in an altercation that allegedly grew out of an argument over a cup of coffee.

Sheriff H. A. Cassidy announced he had arrested Clifford Johnson, 24, on an open charge in connection with Colts' death.

The sheriff said the two men got into an argument over coffee in a local drug store. They went outside, where the altercation allegedly continued.

Colts came here from Aberdeen, Wash., and has been working in the Buzard mill. Johnson arrived three weeks ago from Oklahoma.

BLAZE ON HUGE FLYING BOAT TO BE INVESTIGATED

BALTIMORE, Dec. 6 (AP) — Glenn L. Martin company officials today began a "very complete examination" to determine the damage and cause of an accident and fire that struck the 70-ton Mars, world's largest flying boat, as it started water tests.

The ship went suddenly out of control and beached in shallow water with one of its four engines in flame, flames scorched the plane's side, and the 2,000-horsepower engine was turned into twisted wreckage.

SITKA, Alaska, Dec. 6 (AP) — A dynamite-laden barge caught fire in the channel between here and the Sitka air base today and a nearby native village was evacuated in fear the dynamite might explode before the barge could be subdued.

The commander of the naval air base at Sitka headquartered at the 13th naval district headquarters at Beatty that it was feared the barge would be a total loss.

Trucks and other vehicles were dispatched to downtown points in central Singapore to transport the men to their ships, flying fields and army posts.

Murder Charged In Death of Man At Cottage Grove

EUGENE, Dec. 6 (AP) — Henry Delmo Steel, swarthy 53-year-old Lorane logger, was in the county jail today under \$500 bail and facing a second-degree murder charge in the connection with the death Thursday night of William C. Overholser, 47-year-old Cottage Grove service station operator.

Overholser died as the result of blows about the head and face which caused internal hemorrhages and strangulation, according to a report of the autopsy performed by Dr. Joseph Beaman, in charge of the state police crime detection laboratory, with Doctors William and Guy Earl of Cottage Grove.

Steel, according to Chief of Police Myron Perry of Cottage Grove, admitted hitting Overholser "once or twice" with his fists "while the two men were 'settling' and argument over 50 cents Overholser claimed Steel owed him from the sale of a battery.

ITALIAN KING ESCAPES BOMBS

ROME, Dec. 6 (AP) — King Vittorio Emanuele narrowly escaped a British air raid Thursday at San Giovanni, on the toe of the Italian boot, where he was en route home from a nine-day visit to British-bombed places in Sicily, it was disclosed today upon the monarch's return to Rome.
