WHEAT SHOOTS TO FOUR-YEAR PEAK

CHICAGO, Dec. 11 (A) Wheat prices shot up almost 5 cents a bushel today to peaks since 1937.

Although American-axis dec iarations of war were received calmly in the grain pits at first, buying enthusiasm expanded af-ter mid-session and prices of all cereals soured to top levels for the past two months and, in some cases, for the past four years. Soybeans were up 6 cents, the maximum permitted in one day, the emergency cellings naving been lifted.

Buying of wheat was attributed to mills and other consuming interests as well as investors and professional traders. Washington reports that price control legislation may be delayed at tracted attention.
