WHEAT BACKS DOWN FROM PEAK PRICES

CHICAGO, Dec. 12 (AP)—Wheat prices backed down today from four-year peak levels as the market absorbed profit taking and selling inspired by reports of increased sale of grain from producers' hands in some localities.

Losses amounted to about a cent at times but the market gained sufficient support from mills and professional traders to withstand the profit taking easily. Large eastern chain bak-

ers were reported inquiring for 500,000 barrels of flour and the army announced a substantial purchase at Minneapolis. Despite attractive prices well above government loan rates, Kansas City reports indicated producers continued to show indifference to wheat redemption of loan wheat.

Wheat closed unchanged to a lower than yesterday, December \$1.26 1/2, May \$1.39 1/4; corn unchanged to a higher, December 79 1/2c, May 85c; oats unchanged to a higher, December 1-1/2c lower; soybeans unchanged.

STOCK MARKET DEALERS TAKE CAREFUL OATH

NEW YORK, Dec. 12 (AP)—War optimism was not enough to keep a stock market rally going today and an assortment of leaders negotiated a quiet retreat after an early sortie.

It was the slowest session of the week to date, the turnover being around 1,100,000 shares. Reports that American and British contingents were holding off Japanese invaders in the Philippines and Malaya aroused considerable hopefulness in financial quarters. In the matter of speculative operations, though, the inclination was to proceed carefully pending more definite information as to the Pacific conflict.

In arrears the greater part of the day were US Steel, Youngstown Sheet, General Motors, Chrysler, US Rubber, Goodrich, Union Pacific, Southern Pacific, Consolidated Edison, Anaconda, Kennecott, Montgomery Ward, Sears Roebuck, American Can, General Electric, Eastman Kodak, Allied Chemical and United Aircraft.

Contesting offerings were Western Union, which made further response to the company's good earnings statement; Texas Co., Santa Fe, Pennsylvania, Cerro de Pasco, American Smelting, Phelps Dodge, Du Pont, Johns-Manville, Glenn Martin, Sperry and Westinghouse.

Bonds maintained a relative steady course. Commodities were mixed.
