The 1941 issue of Klamath high school Pelican cagers, pine-tall but fir-green, makes its bow to hometown fans tonight in the KUHS gym against Yreka. Two games are scheduled, one pitting the Wildcats against a Miner secondary.

Coach Dutch French this morning said his starters would be Capt. Gene Love and George Brostehous at forwards, Jim Cox at center, and Jim Bocchi and Ingar Swanson at guards.

The other three give this year's Pelicans a slightly green tinge. Cox, a 6-foot three-inch graduate from Wildcat ranks, has never seen Bigbill action.

French said the team has about the same speed as last year's model and is taller. Love and Swanson stretch about 6-1, Bocchi is 6-2, Cox 6-3, and Brostehous 6-5.
