

NAVY MODIFIES REQUIREMENTS FOR RECRUITS

A relaxation of physical standards for enlistments in the U. S. navy and the naval reserve was announced this week by the navy department. In commenting on this action the navy department announcement stated that numerous men who in past months have sought to enlist and have been rejected on the basis of minor physical defects will, because of the modification of physical standards, be encouraged to re-apply for enlistment in either the regular navy or the naval reserve for the duration of the emergency.

The navy department has requested that any person knowing of young men who had been barred from enlistment in the navy or the naval reserve because of minor physical reasons should bring this modification in physical requirements to the attention of these young men.

Applicants with varicose veins will be acceptable under the changed standards, this varicose condition to be corrected, if the condition is painful, at the naval training stations which the new recruits are sent. Hydrocele, another defect that formerly ruled out numerous applicants, will be corrected, if necessary, after enlistees arrive at training stations. Applicants suffering from hernia will be accepted provided their I. Q's are 75 or better. Recruits suffering from hernia will be treated at the training stations and will be enrolled for schooling during their periods of convalescence.

Other physical defects which formerly prevented men from being accepted as recruits, but which now are waived, are seasonal hay fever, correctible nasal deformities or nasal deformities of such a degree as not to interfere with duty; undernourished and underdeveloped applicants, providing the condition is not due to organic disease, and minor surgical defects which can be corrected within a month. Applicants who possess 18 natural service teeth, with at least two molars in functional occlusion and not more than four incisors missing, will be acceptable. Dental treatment will be given at the training stations.

Any applicant who has been rejected because of any of the defects noted above is urged to re-apply for enlistment in the navy or naval reserve immediately.

All applicants accepted with defects requiring correction will be hospitalized. After correction of these defects recruits will be returned to their training stations at the earliest practicable time.

These modified physical standards will apply for all applicants for enlistment in either the regular navy or the naval reserve with the exception of applicants for enlistment in classes for prospective commissioning.

Agriculture in Good Condition, Says AAA Man

CORVALLIS, Dec. 17 (AP)—Art Cummings, assistant to the western regional AAA director, said yesterday agriculture was in the best condition in history to meet the United States' war demands.

He gave credit to the AAA program, particularly to the ever-normal granary plan.

Dr. C. W. Chenoweth, University of Idaho professor, told 250 Oregon AAA committeemen at their annual conference that the entire farm program will fall unless the U. S. wins this war. He urged labor, capital and farmers to work together.

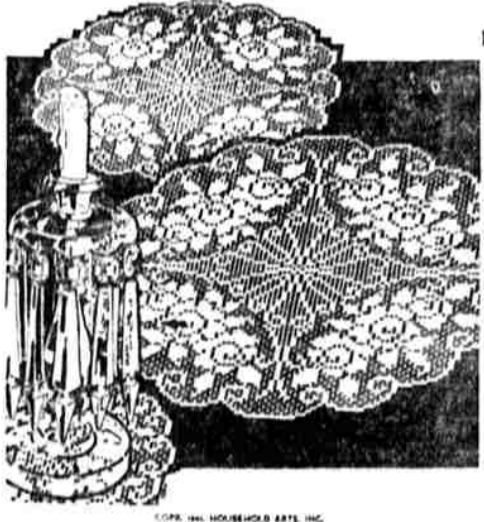
Extension and experiment station agents met with AAA men today in the first session of the annual agricultural and home economics workers' conference.

Snack Parties Go Latin With These Appetizers

Latin American appetizers or hors d'oeuvres are gay and colorful. Open-faced sandwiches are made with crusty French bread topped with paper thin slices of chicken, ham, sausage or cheese. For a snack party, the Latin American hostess serves these appetizers with cafe con leche (coffee with hot milk). She holds a pot of scalding hot coffee in one hand and a jug of hot milk in the other and pours both coffee and milk into cups at the same time.

For your bridge or late supper party, you might go Latin-American, too. Here's a suggestion for the menu:

Avocado Canapes—Hot crab canapes, orange halves Mexican, celery stuffed with bleu cheese, "shrimp cooked double," open face sandwiches, coffee.

Avocado Canapes—Combine washed avocado pulp with highly seasoned chili sauce and spread on small strips of toast or crisp crackers.

Hot Crab Canapes—Flake crabmeat fine; season with salt, pepper, onion and lemon juice. Spread on strips of toast, put a little creamed butter on top, sprinkle with grated cheese and brown in hot oven. Serve hot.

Brazilians Boast Savory Dish of Yesterday's Roast

"Old clothes" in Brazil means a savory dish made of yesterday's roast. Brazilian housewives make delicious chicken soup from leftovers too, and serve it with an egg yolk dropped into each bubbling bowlful. Left-over cabbage with onion dressing is another specialty. So is pudding made from leftover pumpkin, and accompanied with little cups of black coffee sweetened with moist brown sugar in the Latin-American way.

"OLD CLOTHES" (Serves 4 to 8)

Four cups shredded cooked meat, 2 tablespoons fat, 3 shredded onions, 2 tablespoons minced parsley, 1 cup drained canned tomato, 1/2 tablespoon vinegar, salt and pepper to taste.

Cook the meat slightly in the fat, but do not brown. Add the remaining ingredients together with a cup of water, and simmer until the sauce has largely evaporated. Serve with boiled potatoes cut in slices a half inch thick and sprinkled with minced parsley.

CABBAGE WITH ONION DRESSING—Slice Savoy cabbage and cook tender in salted water, or use left-over cabbage. Serve hot or cold with a sauce made by combining three tablespoons oil, 1 1/2 tablespoons vinegar, salt, pepper and mild onion sliced paper thin.

PUMPKIN PUDDING (Serves 4 to 6)

One-half cup granulated sugar, 2 eggs, 1 cup cooked pumpkin pulp, 1/2 cup light brown sugar, 2 tablespoons melted butter, 1

tablespoon flour, few grains salt, 1 cup milk, 1 teaspoon nutmeg, 1 teaspoon cinnamon.

Caramelize (melt) the granulated sugar, and pour into four custard cups. Beat the eggs. Add the remaining ingredients in the order given and transfer to the

custard cups. Stand them in a pan of hot water and bake in a moderate oven until firm, about 30 minutes. Cool, and unmold in sauce dishes.
