## Formosa Quake Toll Set at 319

**TOKYO, Dec. 18** (Official radio received by AP)—The ministry of overseas affairs announced today that 319 persons were killed and 437 were injured by the disastrous earthquake in southern Formosa yesterday. The ministry reported 1768 homes were destroyed. Railway, telephone and telegraph communications were said to have been completely restored.
