Western Pine Orders Down

PORTLAND, Ore., Dec. 19 (AP)—The Western Pine association reported today that 88 mills had orders totaling 61,719,000 board feet for the week ending Dec. 13, compared with 61,109,000 the week before and 74,563,000 a year ago.

Shipments were 62,394,000 feet for the week against 64,482,000 a week ago and 80,475,000 a year ago. Production totaled 60,314,000 board feet for the week compared with 62,546,000 a week ago and 67,107,000 a year ago.

Salem to Test Signal System For Air Raids

SALEM, Dec. 19 (AP)—In order to test the new signal system that will sound air-raid warnings at six places throughout the city, Salem will have its first practice blackout some time between 9 p. m. and midnight Sunday.

The test also will determine how thoroughly and how quickly the city can be blacked out. In addition to the six whistles on the signal system, the city hall siren and sirens on fire trucks and police cars will be used.

One blast will indicate the air raid warning, while the all clear signal will be two blasts.
