### FIRE RESERVES HEAR AMBROSE OUTLINE PLANS

A special meeting of the fireman's volunteer reserves was held Wednesday night at the central fire hall, to acquaint the various squad leaders with the functions that will be required of them and their divisions in emergency work.

The meeting was presided over by Fire Chief Keith K. Ambrose, who gave an explanation of incendiary bombs and ways to combat them. Chief Ambrose has worked out a plan to divide the city into nine districts, each district being in charge of an eight-man squad which will cover the district and make a detailed plan of all buildings and fire fighting possibilities therein.

Howard H. Smith of Howard-Cooper corporation was unanimously elected secretary and publicity director of the new reserve organization. All members of the reserve who have already signed up for duty are urged by Chief Ambrose to be at the central fire hall Sunday morning at 10 o'clock for drill and instruction. "Ten o'clock means 10 o'clock and everyone must be there by that time," said Ambrose. "Members who come in late, work a hardship on themselves and all others of the organization and much precious time is lost in going over previous explanations."

### There's Small Fry Fun In Playing Santa Claus

Making candies and cookies for Grandma (and other friends and relatives) is part of a youngster's Christmas fun. A wise mother encourages her young children to turn out simple confections (under her supervision, if necessary), and wrap them in wax paper and lovely boxes. Here are some delicious recipes. They need careful preparation but they are neither complicated nor expensive!

#### CHOCOLATE MOLASSES TAFFY

(Makes 5 Dozen 1-inch Pieces) One cup brown sugar, firmly packed, 1-3 cup corn syrup, 2-3 cup water, 1 cup molasses, 1 teaspoon salt, 2 tablespoons butter, 4 squares unsweetened chocolate, melted; 1 teaspoon vanilla.

Combine sugar, corn syrup, water, molasses, salt, and butter. Place over low flame and stir constantly until mixture boils. Continue boiling until a small amount of syrup becomes brittle in cold water (290 deg. F.), stirring frequently to prevent scorching. Pour on greased platter or candy slab. Pour chocolate over candy. As candy cools on edges, fold edges toward center with spatula; add vanilla and continue folding until candy is cool enough to handle. Pull un-

til cold. Stretch out in long rope and cut with scissors in pieces of desired size.

#### MINCEMEAT HERMITS

One-half cup shortening, 1 cup sugar, 2 eggs, 1 cup milk, 2 cups flour, 3 teaspoons baking powder, 1 teaspoon salt, 1 teaspoon cinnamon, 1 teaspoon cloves, 1 teaspoon allspice, 1 cup mincemeat.

Cream shortening, add sugar, well-beaten eggs and milk. Mix and sift flour, baking powder, salt and spices and add a small amount to first mixture. Add mincemeat and rest of flour. A little more flour may be needed if mincemeat is very moist. Drop batter by teaspoonsful onto a greased baking sheet. Bake in a moderate oven (325 deg. F.) until delicately browned.

#### FIG, DATE, NUT BALLS

(Makes 3 dozen balls) One-half cup ground dried figs, 1 cup ground dates, 1 cup ground nut meats, dash of salt, 4

teaspoons lemon juice, 1 teaspoon grated lemon rind. Combine fruits, nuts, salt, lemon juice, and lemon rind, and mix until blended. Shape into balls about 1/2 inch in diameter. Roll in powdered sugar.
