Dispatches Show Critical Situation in Philippines

Editor's Note: On the basis of late dispatches from Manila, the situation in the Philippines verges on the critical, with the Japanese apparently enjoying both air and naval superiority. The position is analyzed in the following dispatch by a United Press correspondent long stationed there and intimately familiar with Philippine affairs.

By DON DILLON, United Press Philippine Expert. Allied defenses in the Far East appear to be facing their gravest peril since outbreak of the war. The Philippines assault by an estimated 80,000 Japanese troops makes the American position nearly as grave as that of the British, who are in imminent danger of losing Hong Kong and who are withdrawing from another of the approaches to Singapore. Strategists familiar with the Philippines defense situation have nothing but highest praise for the foresight and courage of Gen. Douglas MacArthur, who commands United States armed forces in the Far East. But for four years military experts have disagreed with his assertions that subjugation of the Philippines would involve suicidally staggering losses for any enemy.

Air Superiority. The hard-to-take but apparent facts emerge from the latest American dispatches from the Orient. 1. The Japanese apparently have gained superiority in the air. It is noteworthy that Far Eastern dispatches Monday mentioned little activity by American planes. This does not mean the entire Far Eastern air force has been put out of action. It does indicate Japanese landings in the Philippines can be effected against little more than land resistance, which may be ineffective in contrast to air resistance. A cluster of 80 enemy transports would hardly have dared venture up to the Luzon coast, a thousand miles from Japan, if they were exposed to mass American air assault.

2. American defenders on Luzon have scored a number of victories against the invaders, but all of them have been minor. Official communiques indicate the Japanese have not been forced to retire from any of their four major landing points. The defenders undoubtedly have harassed the invaders seriously, but have not been able to reverse the trend of consistent successful landings and reinforcements. The Luzon situation, however, contains some bright aspects. The invaders still face difficult terrain in Luzon and Mindanao, and a native opposition that will be all the more determined because of reports the invaders have assaulted Filipino women - whether or not these reports are confirmed.

The invaders must drive through a narrow, heavily timbered valley if they smash toward the Lingayen gulf area. This may be the scene of the greatest struggle in the battle for the Philippines. However, Gen. MacArthur may not concentrate too much manpower in this area, because there remains the possibility an equally great force will land on the eastern coast of southern Luzon, whence a drive toward Manila would be easier than from Lingayen. "The Japanese may eventually 'take over' the islands, but they will find most Filipino surly subjects with an undying will to restore the democracy taught them by Americans in the past 40 years. There is every reason to believe a 'conquered' Filipino people would give the Japanese as much trouble as Paris has given the Germans, and almost as much as the Yugoslav Chetniks have given the nazis.
