Upon completion of the seven and one-half months training course, he will then be granted a second lieutenant's commission in the air corps reserve and go on active duty where he receives up to \$245.00 per month, a \$500 cash bonus for each year in the service and is fully prepared to take up commercial work upon his release from the service.


