The Will for Peace

Editor's Note: For many years, the Christmas editorial on this page has been written by a local minister. This tradition is fulfilled again this year. The author of today's editorial is a newcomer to the page; he writes a message of reassurance that is welcome in this period of doubt and confusion.

Pastor, Altamont Community Presbyterian Church N this anniversary of the coming of the Prince of Peace to earth the chief topic of conversation is war. After almost nineteen and a half centuries of seeking to interpret through daily living, the gospel of peace, more nations and people are engaged in war than any one conflict has brought before. We are told that the present struggle may be a long one and that even more nations are likely to have their part in it before the finish. It would seem that Christ

While "Peace on earth, good will toward men" is almost totally defeated in the light of world affairs today, yet I believe we are safe in saying that there never was a time when greater effort was being put forth for peace. We can say without question that America did not want war and has tried by every possible means to maintain peace and I think that Christ and His gospel is responsible for that attitude. And there are other nations now in the struggle which did not want war, and it isn't unlikely that if a plebiscite had been taken in any one or all of the present warring nations there would have been an overwhelming majority in favor of maintaining peace.

That attitude in favor of continued peace was not present at the time of the birth of Christ. It has come since. 
