U. S. Recovering Quickly After Heavy Damage to Defenses at Honolulu

By TOM YARBROUGH HONOLULU, Dec. 26 (AP)—Tattered skeletons of huge hangars at the army's Hickam field stood today as gaunt evidence of the surprise Japanese attack on this placid pleasure-spot, and in them lay the twisted and charred wreckage of the many onetime guardians of Hawaiian skies.

Army authorities allowed reporters to inspect targets of the Dec. 7 raid for the first time Tuesday. "This is no conducted tour," they pointed out. "You can see anything you want."

There was great damage, some of which reflected a knowledge on the part of the invaders as to just where to strike—and at the same time showed how quickly the army made up its losses and was bristling with readiness for another attack.

It was at Wheeler field where the Japanese singled out vital targets and went after them, leaving less important objectives untouched. Most casualties at Wheeler field occurred in the barracks, which were damaged heavily. Machine-gun bullets left their marks abundantly on many buildings and over the field—reminders of the low altitude strafing that made it a matter of life or death for men to get their planes into the air.

Mickey Rooney Leader at Box Office for 3rd Year

HOLLYWOOD, Dec. 26 (AP)—Clark Gable and Gary Cooper may catch mamma's eye and dad may go for Betty Grable or Gene Tierney, but it's the kids who rule the box office.

For the third straight year, irrepressible Mickey Rooney tops a national exhibitors' poll as the movies leading box office attraction. Before him, little Shirley Temple led four successive years, 1935-38. In the 10 years the Motion Picture Herald has conducted the poll not a matinee idol nor a glamour girl ever has won. Marie Dressler led in the first two, 1932-33, and Will Rogers was first in 1934.

WILLAMETTE U. TEAM RETURNS

SALEM, Dec. 26 (AP)—Willamette university's 51-member football party, stranded in Honolulu when the Japanese attacked Pearl Harbor, was due back in Salem late today.

The party landed in San Francisco yesterday afternoon, coming in steamer on a troop ship, with the players attending wounded soldiers and sailors on the ship.

In a telephone conversation last night, Coach Roy S. Keene, at Davis, Calif., told Ron Gemmell, sports editor of the Salem Oregon Statesman:

"When the bombing began in Honolulu we were all eating breakfast at the hotel. We saw water splashing in the harbor and asked a waiter what it was. "It's a whale spouting," the waiter said. "We all trooped out to watch it, treating it as a joke. We didn't know until late in the afternoon what had happened. "The football boys were put on guard duty, guarding equipment, and the women went to the hospital for duty."
