At the same time the price administration suggests that motorists stop all "unnecessary" driving to conserve their tires. No new tires or tubes will be

available for millions of autoists who normally purchase a total of 4,000,000 tires each month. No restrictions were placed, however, on sale of used or rebesides civilian motorists, of-cilities "are already available."

Price Control Administrator Leon Henderson, who will administer the rationing program, urged all motorists who will not receive tires to halt unnecessary pense. 1-11mtf driving and to "double up" in driving to work. 
