Bowling for Beginners
Bowling Don'ts Are Also Important; Keglers Must Remember Fundamentals
(Eleventh of 12 articles)

Greatest Match Game Bowler
A positive rather than negative approach to bowling is naturally preferred, but there are some important don'ts that all bowlers must keep in mind.
The position of the hand is one of the most important factors in correct bowling. In throwing a hook, a right-handed bowler twists his hand in a counter-clockwise direction. Bowlers should guard against letting the hand open and imparting a clockwise twist. This results in a backup ball which is not effective.
Don't cross the foul line, even if you are only bowling for fun and will incur no penalty. Bowl the right way at all times.
On the other hand, don't try to guard against fouls by releasing your ball half way to the foul line.
Don't try to see how fast you can leave the ball. Speed has nothing to do with getting higher scores.
Set the ball down. Don't bounce it or loft it down the alley. The crashing of ball against alley indicates your delivery is not smooth.
Take your time. While the pin ball is returning your ball, rest up for your second shot. Don't alternate two balls, throwing them in rapid succession.
Steer clear of trick shots and fancy deliveries. Stick to the approved forms.
Bowling takes time and practice. Don't get discouraged. Remember, a few fundamentals—position of hand, regular footwork, a smooth approach and delivery, an extreme follow through, and angling for spares—are the keys to bowling success.
