WASHINGTON, Jan. 3 (UP)—OPM's order banning sales of all new cars will ruin many small dealers, President L. Clare Cargile of the National Automobile Dealers Association said here Friday night. "Other projected drastic government regulations," he said, "promise to wipe out most of those strong enough to survive this first shock." Cargile's statement followed a day of consultation by telephone and telegraph with leading retail dealers throughout the nation. The association is spokesman for 44,000 dealers employing 500,000 persons. In launching a "nation-wide fight to prevent wholesale bankruptcy among dealers," the association asked: 1. That new car price ceilings, if any, be fixed at present or recent retail prices charged by individual dealers. 2. Liberal used car price ceilings, if any. 3. Units purchased or requisitioned by the government to be paid for at regular prices without discount. 4. Distribution of all cars through dealers. Cargile said dealers will present the suggestions to government officials within the next few days.
