F. R.'S SPEECH SPARKS BRIEF STOCK FLURRY

NEW YORK, Jan. 6 (AP)—The stock market experienced a brief rallying flurry today as the president revealed his \$56,000,000,000 war building program to congress but trends soon reverted to the irregularity which prevailed from the start.

Aircrafts turned around and pushed up briskly when the chief executive told of a production schedule of 125,000 planes in the 1943 fiscal year. Most quickly backed away as the rest of the list refused to follow through on the swing.

While there were a number of fairly strong performers visible at the close, losses of fractions to 2 or so were well spread over the ticker tape. Transfers for the five hours approximated 900,000 shares.

Brokers attributed the day's hesitancy in many instances to profit cashing on the recent market bulge which was the widest on average since September, 1939.

GRAINS SWING UP WITH STOCK RALLY

CHICAGO, Jan. 6 (AP)—The rally in stocks, touched off by the president's message to congress, soon spread to the commodity markets today and grain prices rallied sharply.

Under the leadership of soybeans which jumped 2 1/2 cents a bushel, wheat futures rose around a cent to the day's best levels. Corn was inclined to lag but all other grains were stronger.

The advance in soybeans was due partly to the impetus of stop loss buying. Some renewed milling activity was in evidence in the wheat pit and limited offerings forced prices upward. Profits taking sales again appeared, however, and buying enthusiasm was slowed down somewhat at times.

Closing prices for wheat were 1c to 1 1/2 cents about Monday's final quotations, May 1.29 1/2-1.29, July 1.30 1/4-1.30; corn unchanged to 1c up, May 85 1/4-1c, July 87 1/4-1c; oats 1c to 1 1/2c higher; soybeans advanced 1c to 1 1/2c; rye gained 1c to 1c and led was 2 1/2c lower to 5 cents a hundredweight higher.
