Van Emon and son Maurice, returned this weekend from Annapolis, Md., where they attended the graduation ceremony at the United States naval academy where their son, Carlton Allen Van Emon received his bachelor of science degree and his commission as ensign in the US navy. The graduation took place December 19. Ensign Van Emon was originally assigned to the USS Arizona before the war; one of the ships destroyed at Pearl Harbor. He has now been assigned to study radio engineering for two and one-half months at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology in Boston, and then will go to the navy research laboratory in Washington, D. C., for an additional two and one-half months. The Van Emons were accompanied home by their daughter, Elizabeth, who stopped in Albany, near San Francisco, where she has a position with the government's bureau of chemistry and engineering. She has been in Washington for the past year and a half. While in the east the Van Emons enjoyed seeing the Army-Navy football game in Philadelphia on November 29. They also visited Gettysburg, Washington, New York and Chicago en route home.
