

# ESKIMO YOUTHS LIKE THE ARMY BUT NOT K. P.

ANCHORAGE, Alaska, Jan. 9 (UP)—Six Eskimo youths who left their Arctic homes near Point Barrow to enlist in the United States army six weeks ago like their duties fine—except, of course, "K. P."

"The officers and non-coms are too good to us," said Lloyd Ahavkana, spokesman for the group. "It seemed hard at first to be in a place like this, but we're adjusting ourselves fast. Kitchen police duty is tough—but everybody's doing it."

Veteran army officers deem the Eskimos excellent material, although none of the six had ever seen a train, tree or mountains until they hit the snow-covered trails for this bustling military center.

Ahavkana hauled gasoline for launches during the search for a party of lost Russian fliers in 1937. His companions are Isaac Tallach, soon to become a corporal; Clifford Mongoyuk, Eddie Hopson, Hoover Koonalook and Bartlett Kudvalak.

All are former reindeer-herdsmen and sealers, and are excellent marksmen; all were on the scene of the tragic plane crash of Will Rogers and Wiley Post near Point Barrow.

Their departure from the little northern outpost occasioned intense pride in Point Barrow as its first contribution to the national defense effort. For days the six youths paraded in formation through streets, adopting what they thought was the correct military technique.

Curiously, none had ever used skis until they arrived at Anchorage, 700 miles south of Point Barrow. Now they are enthusiastic—and proficient—enthusiasts.

The six Eskimos are under the direct supervision of an experienced Alaskan soldier, Capt. Donald M. B. Adler, Alaska department commander of the American Legion in 1939.

"These men are proud of their uniforms," Capt. Adler told me. "They're excellent soldiers, quick to learn. They could put a rifle together after a sergeant had stripped it but once in a demonstration."

## Try Tax Trick on Frosted Cupcakes for Party Treat

Offer your guests a glistening tray of "tax" cup cakes to start their year off well. When you pour the cake batter into the cups, drop a brand new penny, wrapped in cellophane, into each cup. It's a good way to help the party with a laugh.

**Income Tax Cup Cakes**  
Two and one-fourth cups sifted cake flour, 24 teaspoons combination baking powder, 14 teaspoon salt, 4 cup butter or other shortening, 1 cup sugar, 2 eggs, well beaten, 4 cup milk, 1 teaspoon vanilla.

Sift flour once, measure, add baking powder and salt, and mix together three times. Cream butter thoroughly, add sugar gradually, and cream together until light and fluffy. Add eggs and beat well. Add flour, alternately with milk, a small amount at a time, beating after each addition until smooth. Add vanilla. Bake in greased cup-cake pans in moderate oven (375 deg. F.) 20 to 25 minutes, or until done.

Frost with your favorite orange or butter frosting.

**Chicken and Mushrooms**  
Two hard-cooked eggs, 1 raw egg, 3 tablespoons butter, 1 8-ounce can button mushrooms, 23 cups cold cooked (or canned) chicken, cubed, 1 cup chicken stock or gravy, 2 tablespoons flour, 4 teaspoon salt, 1 teaspoon pepper, 4 teaspoon celery salt, 2 tablespoons chopped chives, 1 cup sherry or non-alcoholic sherry flavoring.

Press yolks of hard-cooked eggs through a sieve. Add dash of salt, pepper and enough of the raw egg to make a thick paste. Form into small balls, roll in a little flour and saute until light brown in 1 tablespoon butter; saute mushrooms in remaining butter for 5 minutes. Add chick-

non-alcoholic sherry flavoring) a little at a time. Do not allow to boil. Remove from fire, add remainder of raw egg and stir for one minute; pour into serving dish and garnish with egg balls and hard-cooked egg whites put through sieve. Serve with wedges of hot toast.

## MANY MEN NEEDED FOR ALASKAN WORK

Seven-hundred and fifty carpenters, 75 electricians and 65 plumbers are needed immediately for work on Alaskan defense projects, local Building Trades council officials said Friday.

Carpenter pay is \$1.35 per hour for 48-hour week and time and one-half for overtime. The jobs will last for 18 months. Board in Alaska is \$1.50 per day. Transportation from Seattle will be paid by the Seims-Drake Puget Sound company, the employer. Applications must be members of the AFL union or willing to join.

Fifty apprentice carpenters of three years experience are also needed. Pay is \$1.15 per hour for three-year apprentices and \$1.25 for those with four years' experience. Other conditions are the same.

Electrician pay is \$1.55 per hour and plumbers will also get \$1.55. Other conditions are identical to the carpenters.
