WAR AND TAX CLOUDS DAMP STOCK MARKET

NEW YORK, Jan. 10 (AP) — War and tax clouds dampened recovery efforts in today's stock market and leading issues dipped fractions to a point or so.

The list looked as though it might put on a feeble rally in early dealings but bidders soon began to fade and, while a few favorites managed to contest the shift with modest improvement, losses were well in the majority at the close.

American Telephone was fairly successful in contesting the retreat, the theory here being this stock may have been "oversold." Western Union was responsive in response to the company's upswing in earnings.

In the backward column were U. S. Steel, Bethlehem, General Motors, U. S. Rubber common and preferred, Douglas Aircraft, J. C. Penney, American Smelting, Du Pont and Texas Co.
