

FOX VISITS HOME OF CRATER RANGER

CRATER LAKE—While entertaining friends Sunday evening Ranger W. T. Frost noticed a fox peering into the window of his residence. Mrs. Frost then placed raw meat on the window sill which kept the fox at the window for approximately two hours.

The fox was a cross phase of the Cascade red fox. Its upper parts were black or dusky, overlaid with whitish tips of long hair. The side of the shoulders, neck and face were a red-yellow or buff. The nose, tail, feet and back of the ears were black while the tip of the tail was snow white.

This incident was very unusual due to the fact that foxes are more often heard than seen. Their presence in a vicinity is generally known only by a short bark, by a pungent dusky odor, or by their long delicate tracks in the snow.

The Cascade fox lives mainly near rocks, and their speed and intelligence protect them against men and dogs. They feed mainly on small rodents. They are known to be very cautious, cunning and swift. Their long, fluffy tail adds not only to their beauty but also plays a big part in helping them get along so swiftly.

Martens are common visitors at the windows of most of the park houses, but this fox proved to be a new and most interesting visitor.
