The recent decision of the Klamath county school board halting the use of school buses for athletic team transportation to and from games has resulted in the use of private cars since a week ago. Now, however, individual car owners are figuring that if the school board, with a priority, feels it inadvisable to squander rubber on athletics they, too. can't afford it.

Perhaps the schedule may be re-arranged to permit two games either doubleheaders or two scott, 19 Scott, 1 consecutive night's play each trip in order to finish the winter program. Thusly the traveling would be halved.

Or possibly a tournament held in the Klamath Union high school gym to determine the championship. The tourney could be staged later, meantime the B boys could split into intramural groups or schedule games on a catch-as-catch-can basis with nearby quintets in order to maintain the competitive element of athletics.

Any way you glance at it, it's a makeshift situation at best and unfortunate at a time when the county, as the nation, needs athletics and the relaxation and education they employ.
