

CHILOQUIN, SPRAGUE RIVER ROAD BAD

SPRAGUE RIVER—The road to Chilquin from Sprague River is now practically impassable and only those of the stoutest hearts even make the attempt. Bob Allen, mailman for Sprague River, is having to come by the way of Klamath Falls to deliver the mail from Chilquin, traveling a distance of 164 miles to cover a distance of 52 miles, which is the round-trip mileage between the two reservation cities. Residents of the farms west of Sprague River are leaving their children with relatives and friends in town here and are not attempting to make the trip in.

On several of the flats the cars have left the road completely and are driving out through the sagebrush where the ground is still frozen. The main road can be traveled east of the CCC camp only when the ground is frosted and then only high centered vehicles are sure of getting through. Water has stood over the road over two feet deep on the stretch between town and the Crume ranch and all traffic over this road has been suspended until the last few days.

Community Dinner Parties Revived By Wartime Hurry

In several communities where the women are active in war work, community dinners are being tried out as time and cost savers. Individual women take turns in preparing and serving a hearty dinner for other members of the group. Here are two excellent recipes for 20 persons.

WINTER STEW

(Makes 20 servings)
Six pounds of beef chuck in cubes, 4 cup flour, 1 tablespoon salt, 1 teaspoon pepper, 1 1/3 cups fat, 1 1/2 quarts hot water, 4 cups sliced onions, 1 1/2 cups diced celery, 2 1/2 cups sliced carrots, 1 quart tomatoes, 4 cup chili sauce.

Roll meat cubes in flour, salt and pepper and brown on all sides in hot fat. Place in large, deep kettle, cover with hot water, and simmer, covered, for 2 hours. Add vegetables and chili sauce and continue to simmer for 30 minutes. Serve with hot boiled rice or steamed potatoes.

LAMB STEW WITH DUMPLINGS

(Makes 20 servings)
Six pounds lamb breast, cut in cubes, 1 cup flour, 6 teaspoons salt, 1 teaspoon pepper, 20 small onions, 3 cups cubed carrots, 2 cups diced turnips, 4 cups potatoes, sliced, 1 recipe dumplings.

Wipe meat with cloth and roll in flour, salt and pepper, place meat in large stew kettle and just cover with boiling water. Simmer, covered, for three hours. Add the vegetables and continue to simmer for 35 minutes. Fifteen minutes before serving time drop dumplings on top of stew by tablespoonsfuls.

DUMPLINGS

(Makes 20 servings)
Eight cups flour, 6 tablespoons phosphate baking powder, 4 teaspoons salt, 3 tablespoons fat, 4 cups milk.

Sift together dry ingredients, cut in fat and add milk slowly. Mix well, and drop spoonfuls on

top of stew, cover tightly and cook 15 minutes. Keep tightly covered while cooking.

MENU

BREAKFAST: Orange juice, oatmeal, toast, coffee, milk.
LUNCHEON: Cream of potato soup, toast, mixed green salad, chocolate gingerbread, tea, milk.

COMMUNITY DINNER: Tomato juice, special lamb stew with dumplings, cole slaw, hot rolls, pumpkin pie, coffee, milk.
