Financing of the project might involve a small tax boost, the council said, but the rise in any case would be much less than the average monthly charge from private concerns. City taxes could not be raised until July, The present tax rate is M.60.

Applicants for the job will be accepted by the council mem-bers during the month, with further action to be taken at the April meeting.
