Informed British quarters declared the purpose of the Salzburg conference obviously was to keep Mussolini in line.

"Hitler must keep both ends of the axis moving in the same direction," these quarters said, "and to do this he must give Mussolini a pep talk."

There was no mention of Japan, the third member of the Rome-Berlin-Tokyo bloc, having been represented at the meeting.

parently left to the Japanese the area around Myingyan, where the Irrawaddy makes a big bend to the west and where earlier attempts to guard the allied right flank failed.

A communique said Japanese patrols had penetrated into the Monywa area, 40 miles north of Myingyan and 55 miles due west of Mandalay, but "were being successfully dealt with."

NEW DELHI, India, May 1 (AP)—United States planes carried out a night raid on Japanese-occupied Rangoon, in Burma, on the night of April 29. It was announced here today. Damage was done to the dock area.

The latest raid was the third on Rangoon by American planes based in India and commanded by Maj. Gen. Lewis H. Brereton. In attacks reported on April 6 and April 18, heavy American bombers blasted Japanese supply bases in Rangoon and set huge fires.

WPB Puts Ban on 'Non-Essential' Use of Electricity

WASHINGTON, May 1 (UP)—The war production board, acting to assure a steady flow of power to arms industries, tonight ordered curtailment of non-essential uses of electricity in shortage areas, including a ban on flood-lighting for night sports and for decorative or advertising lighting.

Ordinary residential use of electricity will not be affected "unless the situation becomes very serious," a spokesman said.

given in dispatches from Australia recently saying that the enemy was gathering ships and men in the mandated islands area. These reports were linked here with the disappearance of powerful Japanese naval units from the Bay of Bengal, off India, about a week ago.

Informed quarters suggested that those units, having carried out a purely raiding and reconnaissance mission against the British there, had been withdrawn eastward in preparation for an attempt to sever the vital sea route between Australia and this country.

Missing Plane Sighted Near Air

ALBUQUERQUE, N. M., May 1 (AP)—A four-motored plane missing from the Albuquerque base since April 22 with seven men aboard was located from the air today at a point 13 miles southwest of Cimarron, in northern New Mexico, the army announced.

The plane disappeared while en route back to Albuquerque base on a routine training flight which had taken it to Kansas City.

applying for the family unit should include him.

NON-MEMBERS OF FAMILY UNITS

1. A person not a member of a family unit applies wherever he may be at the time of registration. (A parent, guardian, or other responsible adult must apply, for such persons under 18 years of age, who are not self supporting.)

2. A person 18 years of age or over, away from home to attend college, should apply wherever he may be. He is not to be included in the family unit.

3. On the other hand, if a person under 18 years of age is away at college, his father, mother or guardian must file application for him.

4. A person is entitled to a war ration book in spite of the fact that he may take all his meals in restaurants, boarding houses, etc.

5. A person registering away from home should go to his local rationing board upon his return home and apply to have his file transferred to his local board.

WAR RATION BOOK ONE

1. Contains 28 stamps. You may buy one pound of sugar with each of the first four stamps. Each stamp is good for only the announced period.

2. Announced period for first four stamps:
a. Stamp 1—May 5 to May 16
b. Stamp 2—May 17 to May 30
c. Stamp 3—May 31 to June 13
d. Stamp 4—June 14 to June 27

3. Periods for other stamps, as well as the amount of sugar for each, will be announced later.

SHOPPERS 'CHECK' NEW PRICE LIDS

WASHINGTON, May 1 (UP)—The office of price administration disclosed Thursday that highly-skilled "shoppers"—professional price checkers—will be employed to help police new retail price schedules which become effective May 18.

Deputy Administrator Dexter M. Keezer said selection of the "shoppers" has not been completed but Robert E. Sessions, new head of OPA's consumer division, revealed that those chosen will be trained by the bureau of labor statistics which long has kept a watchful eye on living costs.

Neither official would outline the specific duties of the "professionals" but it was indicated their work will consist of unannounced appearance at stores throughout the nation to "check up" on observation of price regulations.

class in condemned row. Although California now uses a gas chamber for executions, they hanged James today because he was convicted and sentenced to death by hanging before enactment of the law prescribing death by gas.

Auburn-haired and possessing a way with women, the big 48-year-old Los Angeles barber was convicted of drowning Mary Busch James after failing to kill her by thrusting her bare foot into a box containing two poisonous reptiles—"Lightning" and "Lethal"—which he had rented.

The body of the golden-haired young woman, a manicurist in James' barber shop, was found in a little pond at their home on August 5, 1935, only three months after they were married. She was an expectant mother.

The prosecution contended he wanted her \$21,000 life insurance.
