### Talented Young Musicians Will Appear at Presbyterian Church Friday

One of the recitals of the spring season that is annually attended by a large audience of music lovers is announced for Friday evening, June the twelfth, at eight o'clock at the First Presbyterian church when Mrs. A. J. Vove will present her voice students in song.

A promising young vocalist to be presented on this program is Miss Patricia Brown, fourteen-year-old soprano, who received a one rating in competition at the music festival at the Southern Oregon Normal school in Ashland, followed by competition at the Northwest Music festival at Eugene where she also received a one rating. Miss Brown's song will be "Dawn" by Curran, the number that brought her honors at Eugene.

Mrs. Muriel Garich, a mezzo-soprano whose voice has charmed many Klamath audiences, will sing the Mussetta Waltz from "La Boheme."

Two other talented young matrons who have appeared on these programs several times will be Mrs. Rollin Cantrell, coloratura soprano, whose number will be "The Bell Song" from the opera "Lakme," and Mrs. Jerome Henry, soprano, who will sing "Everywhere I Look," by Carew.

Included in the evening's recital will be one of the ever-popular negro spirituals, "City Called Heab'n," to be sung by Charles Currier, eighteen-year-old basso.

Miss Marie Obenchain, composer and one of the city's most talented pianists, will act as accompanist.
