

HOUSE REFUSES WPA FUND CUT FOR NEXT YEAR

WASHINGTON, June 11 (AP)—By a four-vote margin the house refused today to cut by half the funds proposed for the WPA for the year beginning July 1.

The action by tellers' vote of 12 to 110 came on a motion by Rep. Taber (R-N. Y.) to cut the WPA's direct allotment from \$280,000,000 to \$112,000,000. He explained that there was an additional \$36,000,000 available in the agency's unexpended funds.

Republicans voted almost solidly for the cut, and were joined by approximately two score democrats. Approximately 15 republicans voted against the reduction.

House Majority Leader McCormack (D-Mass.) took the floor to assert that the WPA "has rendered a great service and there is a need for its continuance."

He said that President Roosevelt had cut the requirements "to the bone."

"Does anyone in their right mind really believe that any American man or woman would remain on the WPA rolls if they could find work elsewhere?" added Rep. Voorhis (D-Calif.) "It just doesn't make sense."

At its peak in 1939 the WPA had 3,000,000 jobless persons on its rolls. The proposed funds for next fiscal year would provide for employment of an average of 400,000.

Plans for Plant at Jap Center Talked

MERRILL, June 11—Reports that the government plans establishment of a dehydrating plant at the Japanese center at Tulelake were made at this week's meeting of the Merrill Service club, it was announced by T. W. Chaburn, secretary. While the announcement was not official, plans are progressing toward dehydrating part of the crop that will be raised on the League of Nations land this season, it is said.

Grocers Protest Grant to OPA

CHICAGO, June 11 (AP)—The National Association of Retail Grocers Wednesday asked con-

gress to refuse to grant the office of price administration an appropriation of "several hundred million dollars for 100,000 new employees, largely enforcement personnel."

The action was taken at the association's 45th annual convention in a resolution which said the OPA proposal implied the turning loose of an "army of snoopers" on the retail merchants of the United States.

Favoring adoption of the resolution, Harry Walker of Baltimore asserted he was "convinced that Washington is the only insane asylum that is run by its own inmates."

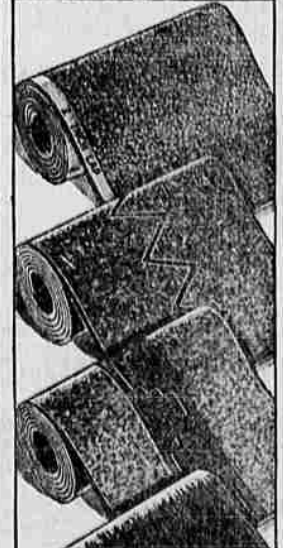

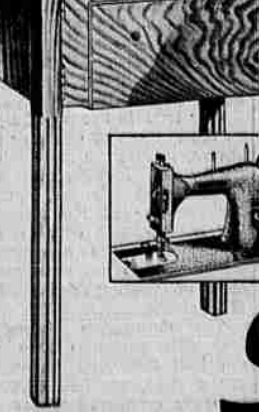
