### Defense Area Landlords Must Register With OPA

WASHINGTON, June 11 (AP)—The office of price administration announced today that landlords renting houses, apartments, flats, tenements and similar housing accommodations in the first 20 defense rental areas now under government control would be required to register next week with OPA rent officials.

The registration, first held since OPA disclosed its rent-freezing program, will begin Monday and must be completed by midnight July 1. OPA said necessary forms could be obtained at banks, city and county offices, real estate offices, fire and police stations, public utility offices and the area rent office.

The defense rental areas involved included San Diego, Calif., and the Puget Sound, Washington, area.

### Push Shot Keeps Ball Low in Wind

Flashiest of Them All

In playing a push shot, I grip the club slightly down the shaft. The ball is played just off the right foot.

Reduce the pivot on the turn.

IN PLAYING PUSH SHOT, GRIP SLIGHTLY DOWN SHAFT.

PLAY BALL A BIT OFF RIGHT FOOT.

REDUCE PIVOT ON TURN, MOVE FAST INTO LEFT SIDE AND SPEED UP HAND ACTION.

Pivot only enough to accommodate the hand and forearm action.

Move very fast into the left side of the swing. Speed up the hand action to compensate for the quick shift.

This enables you to keep the ball low. When you hit into a strong wind, a low trajectory keeps wind resistance at a minimum, prevents it from bothering the flight of the ball.

### Cochrane Sets Service Star Club for Tiff

WASHINGTON, June 11 (AP)—Lieut. Gordon "Mickey" Cochrane, manager of the service all-stars, has chosen 13 soldiers and 10 sailors to make up his team for the benefit game at Cleveland July 7 against the winner of the annual American League-National League all-star contest.

Furthermore, Manager Mickey is serious about winning the Cleveland classic. He has asked that his players be relieved of their military duties in time to report to him at the Great Lakes naval training station 10 days before the game for hard practice.

It is a powerful squad that Cochrane has picked, comprising the cream of big league talent that has answered the colors—Bobby Feller, Hank Greenberg, Cecil Travis, Don Padgett, Johnny Rigney and others. Providing they can reach anything like top playing condition in 10 days of practice they should give their former compatriots a stiff argument in Cleveland's big stadium.

As his coaches Cochrane named Hank Gowdy of the Cincinnati Reds, who was the first big leaguer to enlist in the other World war, and George Earnshaw, former great pitcher with the Philadelphia Athletics and other clubs, now in the navy.
