Parents Warned to Keep Close Check on Youngsters

Following by only three days the sentencing of "The Nails" to indefinite periods in the state training school at Woodburn, Forrest C. Losee, county juvenile officer, today warned parents to maintain a closer check on activities of their youngsters.

Losee said that several complaints of indiscriminate shooting of 22 rifles by children in the Altamont and St. Francis park sections had been referred to his office this week. One group of youngsters, he said, were found to have been shooting directly over the heads of other children with the guns.

A suburban resident reported that some small boys had fired at his garage with .22's while he was working inside. The shot narrowly missed him, Losee said.

In sentencing "The Nails," a pair of boys 12 and 14 years old, to the Woodburn school for ransacking more than a dozen Klamath homes last week, Circuit Court Judge David R. Vandenberg said Monday that he hoped the day would come when

parents of delinquent children would be haled into court to show cause why the children should not be declared delinquent.

Losee said the preponderance of juvenile delinquency cases showed that the children were either separated or apparently not interested in their offspring's welfare.
