

UNSPENT CASH WAR BALANCE \$160 MILLION

WASHINGTON, July 1 (AP)—
Cash balance for the war, \$100,000,000.

Senator Byrd (D-Va.) gave that estimate today of the amount of money already appropriated but unspent for military purposes.

He declared the army, navy and other agencies had congressional authority to draw on the treasury for sufficient cash to carry on the war effort at high speed for about 2 1/2 years.

A \$42,820,000,000 army supply bill awaited President Roosevelt's signature after its approval by congress yesterday in a session that saw the old fiscal year end with no final agreement reached on a disputed \$680,395,000 farm outlay on a house-approved \$1,808,689,000 supplemental defense measure.

Byrd told reporters, treasury reports indicated the new army bill would swell unexpended balances to a point where more than \$5,000,000,000 monthly could be poured into the military effort for 2 1/2 years if congress did not make a single additional appropriation.

"There has been an unexpended balance in the treasury for military purposes ever since July, 1940, when the amount was \$7,000,000,000," Byrd declared. "If we do not have sufficient equipment of all kinds, it certainly cannot be charged to congressional unwillingness to provide the money."

Committee clerks estimated total appropriations in the past six months at \$133,852,000,000, but said they had no way of ascertaining the small percentage of that amount which would pay for routine government activities outside the war effort.

Byrd said he was confident that a reduction of approximately \$1,300,000,000 had been effected in non-defense spending, or about the amount recommended earlier in the year by the special committee on non-essential expenditures which he heads.

Further Car Quota Cut Foreseen

SAN FRANCISCO, July 1 (AP)—OPA officials today foresaw further quota reductions in the remaining seven months of the rationing year in announcing that 25,000 passenger cars would be allotted during July, compared with a June quota of 40,000.

Only about 175,000 automobiles will remain for allotment in the seven months after July, said OPA officials here, explaining that quotas and reserves assigned in the first five months of the rationing year have amounted to well over half the cars available.

July quotas for the western states, excluding state and national reserves, follow (reserves in parentheses): California 2060 (411), Idaho 59 (12), Oregon 207 (41), Washington 384 (66).

NO PROPERTY TAX

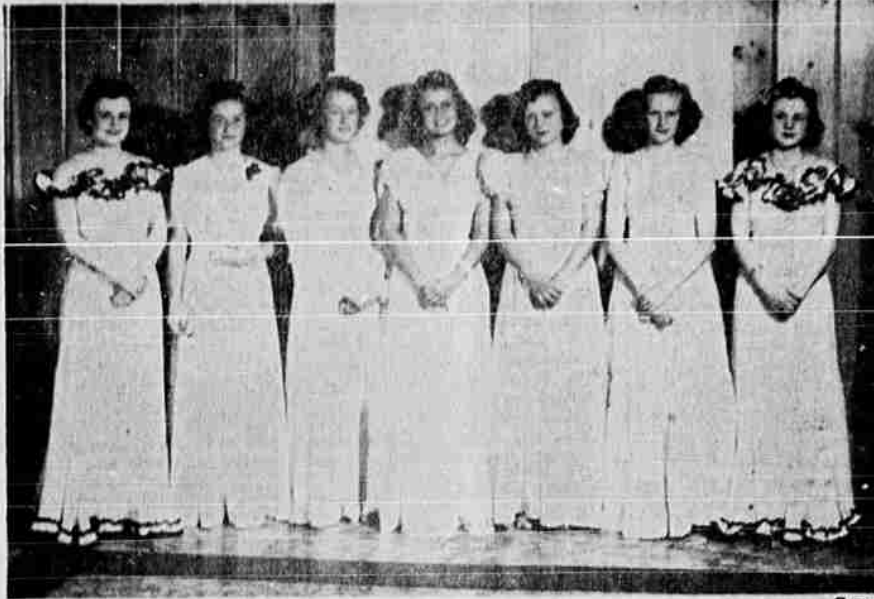
SALEM, July 1 (AP)—The state tax commission announced yesterday that there would be neither a state property tax nor elementary school tax for the fiscal year beginning today.

BOARD CURBS SALE OF MILL MACHINERY

WASHINGTON, July 1 (AP)—The war production board's curbs on sales and deliveries of certain industrial machinery were extended today to cover all orders for a single unit of new woodworking, sawmill and logging equipment costing more than \$250.

Increasing use of plywood and other woods in aircraft, boats and other military items has made wood an important factor in the war program, WPB explained. The amendment to the machinery order, effective immediately, prohibits the sale of woodworking, sawmill and logging machinery except upon "approved orders." Such orders are those of the army and navy, certain other federal agencies, United Nations and lend-lease orders, and certain orders carrying military priority ratings.

Manufacturers and distributors who had orders on their

books on June 30 which were not in the approved category may apply to WPB for permission to fill them. Permission will be granted if WPB deems the orders essential to the war program.

On opening the envelope, the lady found a narrow slip of paper on which was written: "Your boy friend still loves you, but he talks too much." The slip was signed "Censor."

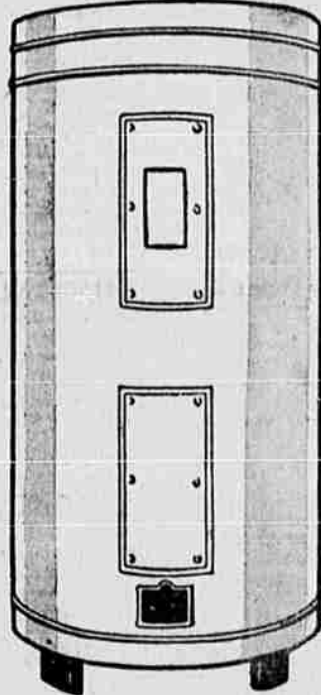
