

# OMINOUS WAR NEWS KEEPS STOCKS DOWN

NEW YORK, July 1 (AP)—Stocks were under a slight downward pull today as buyers remained extremely wary in view of ominous reports from Egypt. Transfers approximated 200,000 shares.

A bit lower most of the time U. S. Steel, Bethlehem Steel, Chrysler, General Motors, Goodyear, Goodrich, Sears Roebuck, United Aircraft, Kennecott, Phelps Dodge, General Electric, Johns-Manville, Texas company and Great Northern preferred.

Eastman Kodak fell as much as 24 points on small offerings. Owens-Illinois and American Can each were down a point or more at the worst. Allied Chemical recorded an early gain of around 2 and American Telephone, after morning heaviness, rallied for a fractional advance.
